Pagpapaunlad ng industriya ng tela sa bawat rehiyon sa bansa, tinutukan ng DOST-PTRI

Pinagtuunang-pansin ng Department of Science and Technology-Philippine Textile Research Institute (DOST-PTRI) ang kahalagahan ng pagpapaunlad ng industriya ng tela ng iba't ibang rehiyon sa katatapos lamang na Philippine Handloom Weaving Conference, Lungsod ng Iloilo.

Kasabay ng pagdiriwang ng 2023 National Science, Technology, and Innovation Week na sa k a u n a - u n a h a n g pagkakataon ay ginanap sa labas ng National Capital Region, kinilala rin ng ahensya ang tungkulin ng iba't ibang sektor upang tuluyang mapayabong ang mga produkto at kabuhayan ng mga manggagawa sa industriya, maging sa labas ng siyudad.

"We are often complaining that development happens only in what we refer to as imperial Manila, or in the more developed parts of the country. And here in our theme, we emphasize there should be inclusivity," ani DOST VI Regional Director Rowen R. Gelonga. "Dapat walang maiiwan. So dapat lahat ng mga regions will be developed when it comes to this sector and beyond, even the weaving sector."

Binigyang-diin din ni Gelonga ang pangangailangang pasiglahin ang mga industriya ng mga rehiyon upang maidikit ang agwat ng kinikita ng mga manggagawa mula sa Visayas at Mindanao gaya ng mga nasa Kalakhang Maynila.

"This [disparity in income] cannot go on forever. We have to develop the regions. We have to develop the countryside," dagdag niya. Tungkulin ng lokal na

pamahalaan Mahalaga rin ang suporta mula sa lokal na pamahalaan upang mapanatiling buhay ang industriya ng Hablon sa munisipalidad ng Miagao, Iloilo, ani Mary Diane N. Flordeliza, tourism officer at kinatawan ni Miagao Mayor Oscar Serag Garin, Jr. para sa ginanap na pagpupulong.

Ang Hablon ay isang uri ng tradisyunal na tela na hinabi gamit ang handloom at kadalasang gawa sa mga hibla ng piña, cotton, at abaca na kilala sa Iloilo.

Ayon kay Flordeliza, ang pagkakaroon ng walong weaving center, pagbuo ng Miagao Weavers Association, at ang pagbibigay ng kabuhayan sa mga manghahabi, lalo na sa mga kababaihan, ay nakatutulong sa pagpapaunlad ng industriya ng Hablon sa lalawigan.

"Isa pong pride namin 'yung aming mga weavers ay very active... For example, when we invite them sa mga seminars, meetings, they really respond to it positively," ani Flordeliza. "They are really interested in growing and improving the industry."

Ngunit hindi maipagkakaila ang kakulangan sa mga materyales, kapital, at mga manghahabi sa paggawa ng Hablon, kung kaya't nahihirapan din silang makipagsabayan sa pangangailangan ng mga mamimili sa loob at labas ng bansa, ani Flordeliza.

Dagdag pa niya, plano ng lokal na pamahalaan na isama ang paggawa ng Hablon sa mga technical-vocational courses upang maibalik ang interes ng kabataan sa paghahabi at magdagdag pa ng mga tulong pinansyal upang maipagpapatuloy ang pagpapaunlad sa industriya.

Samantala, isa sa mga inisyatiba ng Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) ay ang Regional Inclusive and Innovation Center na layong pag-ugnayin ang iba't ibang sektor ng bansa, kasama na ang mga lokal na pamahalaan, akademya, mga mamumuhunan, at marami pang iba, upang magtulungang paunlarin ang industriya sa mga rehiyon sa usaping pangkabuhayan.

"Through this, we can build the local innovation system from which would emerge innovation, research, [and] commercialization. New products, new services, and new business models that address industry and societal issues, thereby generating better employment opportunities, more entrepreneurial activities, and sustainable economic prosperity in the country's regions," paliwanag ni Ma. "The digitized fabric patterns are not available [to the] public. The terms of this will be consulted, kaya tayo mayroong technical working group ng handloom weaving in the Philippines. And at the same time, with the representative weavers on board, kasama rin po kayo [mga manghahabi] sa pag-decide if you want to make it public to your education systems or even to your market," ani Caya. **(ni Kristine Erika L. Nuclear tech can offer solutions to challenges posed by climate change – Sec. Solidum

As the 51st Atomic Energy Week (AEW) kicked off on Monday, December 04, 2023, Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr. of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) sees several opportunities for nuclear science and related studies to help address our concerns on climate change.



The wait is over as the 51st Atomic Energy Week was launched. Here are glimpses of the opening ceremony of the Atomic Energy Week happening at DOST - Philippine Nuclear Research Institute. The said event will run for four days, showcasing the advancements of nuclear science and cutting-edge research. Overall, the first day sets the stage for addressing messages, the official launch of the 1st Philippine Nuclear Science Olympiad, formal commencement, and general promotion activities to increase awareness and understanding of atomic energy. "A week ago, we participated in the Conference of Parties (COP) 28 held in Dubai, and the message is clear. Climate change is a problem that we all need to look in to. We will be victims of global warming, so we need to act, and nuclear technology would play crucial roles in addressing our concerns on this," said Sec. Solidum.

He emphasized how nuclear science and research studies provide solutions as an alternative energy source for power, as well as in developing new breeds of agricultural crops resistant to heat or requiring less water, minimizing the impact on our food supply. "The protection of the environment will also utilize nuclear technology. Although we believe the Philippines is not a major contributor to greenhouse gases, we should look at these pollutants from a health perspective, not only from the climate perspective because we will be affected by pollution, aside from the increased temperature and changes in rainfall patterns all over the country," added Sec. Solidum.

Meanwhile, apart from its well-established roles in medicine, agriculture, and industry, the science chief said that the renewed campaign towards the inclusion of nuclear power in the energy mix adds a new dimension to the roles of DOST-PNRI. This includes not only mastering a potentially invaluable power source for economic progress but also ensuring

safety, security, and responsible use.

"This is the reason why the country's science department has its full support for the efforts of the Nuclear Energy Program Inter-Agency Committee (NEP-IAC), as well as the establishment of a unified independent regulatory body for ionizing radiation sources through the bill for the Philippine National Nuclear Energy Safety Act pending in Congress," said Sec. Solidum.

Gearing up the next generation towards a Nuclear Philippines

The 51st AEW is being celebrated at the DOST-PNRI with institutional partners and guests from December 4-7 at the PNRI grounds in Commonwealth Avenue, Quezon City.

With the theme "Gearing up the next generation towards a Nuclear Philippines," this year's celebration becomes even more thrilling with the inaugural Philippine Nuclear Science Olympiad. Open to junior and senior high school students nationwide, the competition offers cash prizes, meals, and certificates to the top five awardees. Additionally, the highest achiever will represent the country in the first-ever International Nuclear Olympiad scheduled for August next year. Notably, this marks the first in-person AEW celebration since the pandemic.

"I also find particularly commendable the AEW's theme for this year, which is Gearing up the next generation towards a

Nuclear Philippines. It is quite timely and consistent with the DOST's renewed thrust towards reaching out to the youth, inspiring more to take up science-related courses," said Sec. Solidum.

The four-day celebration also features technical sessions where DOST-PNRI researchers and experts share how their various research studies could offer numerous alternative solutions to several pressing concerns in different sectors and communities.

On the other hand, a Gender and Development (GAD) Forum will also be held on December 07, 2023, where there will be an in-depth discussion on how individuals, irrespective of gender, can thrive in this technically demanding field such as nuclear science. The said forum also explores the social dimensions of nuclear S&T, discussing applications, fostering equitable environments, compliance with the Safe Spaces Act, and cultivating positive dynamics in labs and offices.

Of course, one of the main highlights for the participants will be the guided tours and exhibits to all the service facilities at the DOST-PNRI. These include Isotope Techniques, Radioactive, Atomic Structure and Radioactivity, Nuclear Analytic Techniques, Radiation Protection, Radiation Processing and Radiochemistry, Cytogenetics, Microbiology, Food Irradiation, Wound Dressing, Sterile Insect

Techniques, and Irradiation Technologies, among others.

"With a still-stigmatized perception of the word 'nuclear,' it is best that we slowly change such notions by educating and fully informing our young generation. In this day and age, when misinformation is easily proliferated by certain individuals who undermine and disregard the impact they can make on our country's future, it is my hope that through AEW, we will be able to shed light on this crucial and social topic of nuclear science and technology," said DOST-PNRI Director Carlo A. Arcilla.

Messages of support from the partners

"This week, (AEW) acts as a lighthouse, shedding light on the amazing developments and prospects that come from the field of atomic energy. It explores the many facets of nuclear science and provides insight into how it can be used in the industry, agriculture, medicine, and sustainable energy generation, among other fields," said Dr. Leila P. Areola, director of Bureau of Learning

Delivery of the Department of Education.

For his part, Civil Service Commissioner (CSC) Chair Karlo A. B. Nograles said that people generally respond with awe and fear when they hear the word atomic. He pointed out that it is inspiring to know that energy is harnessed when an atom is divided. On the other hand, it is distressing that the same energy can be used for destructive purposes.

"History has shown that atomic power has greatly contributed to the industrialization of the world and has ushered infinite advancement possibilities. Through the years, the DOST-PNRI has utilized the accordance of atomic energy for the benefit of our people and our country. Many of its exemplary initiatives have had a nationwide impact on public interest, security, and patrimony," said Chair Nograles.

The annual AEW celebration is one of DOST-PNRI's platforms for communicating to the public on the latest nuclear and radiation-related innovations. It is also a

venue for scientists, industry professionals, educators, students, and the public to get together to understand and appreciate the contribution of nuclear science in various fields and nuclear S&T's growing role in the country's larger development policy.

The annual AEW celebration, as mandated under Presidential Proclamation No. 1211 in 1973, aims to generate awareness among the Filipino people about the beneficial uses of nuclear science and technology.

E. Visayas surfing instructors told to get accreditation

The Department of Tourism (DOT) in Eastern Visayas has urged surfing instructors in the region to apply for accreditation that would give them more opportunities as the water sport continues to gain local and foreign attractions.

"To be a DOT-accredited surf instructor is equivalent to having a seal of professionalism. It indicates that one has undergone and passed the required training that makes him or her a qualified surf instructor," DOT Eastern Visayas regional director Karina Rosa Tiopes said Thursday.

The accreditation is part of the agency's recognition of the high potential of surfing among sports tourism activities being pushed by the national government.

Popular surfing destinations in the country are Siargao, Baler, San Juan in La Union, Real in Quezon, Zambales, Daet in Camarines Norte, Baras in Catanduanes, Calicoan and Borongan in Eastern Samar, and Lanuza in Surigao del Sur.

Aside from Eastern Samar, other surf spots in Eastern Visayas are in Northern Samar province, Dulag in Leyte, and Silago in Southern Leyte.

The DOT regional office urged surf instructors, particularly those trained and certified by the Academy of Surf Instructors (ASI), to apply for accreditation, as this would give them opportunities to attend seminars and training that would further boost their skills.

In 2021, at least 34 surfers from Leyte, Eastern Samar, and Southern Leyte provinces were certified by ASI after they participated in the training of surf instructors. The capacity building is part of promoting the region as one of the top surfing destinations in the country.

"Being DOT-accredited also gives one the opportunity to attend free skills enhancement or upgrading training and conferences organized or sponsored by DOT," Tiopes added.

The accreditation is not only exclusive to surf instructors, but also includes resorts, surf

camps, and other facilities that provide surfing lessons and related services to clients.

At the 2nd National Surf Summit in Borongan City last December 2-3, two surf instructors trained in 2021 were awarded with ASI-accredited Level 2 Surfing Instructor Certificates.

These two surf instructors are Jerick Alconaba of Borongan City and Jamaica Salceda of Tanauan, Leyte.

Alconaba is one of the hired lifeguards by the Borongan City government, while Salceda is also one of the popular female skimboarders in Leyte province.

The region also has three International Surfing Association (ISA) Level 1 surf judges who are all from Borongan City.

Although the region already has ASI-certified surf instructors and ISA-certified surf judges, none of them are yet accredited by the tourism department. (PNA)

Pacquiao 'excited' to see success of MPBL – Duremdes

The Maharlika Pilipinas Basketball League (MPBL) just concluded its fifth season, and yet league officials are already looking forward to the next one.

Commissioner Kenneth Duremdes said league founder Manny Pacquiao is now thinking of ways to maintain or even exceed the success gained in the recent season moving forward.

The league is looking to open its sixth season by March of next year as Pampanga Giant Lanterns emerged as the new national champion following a 3-0 sweep of Bacoor Strikers in the finals last week.

"Right after ng championship, nagpatawag agad ng meeting si Senator (Pacquiao) sa bahay niya. So nagse-celebrate pa yung buong Pampanga nandun na kami sa bahay niya kasi he's excited dahil nakita niya yung growth and success ng league and gusto niya magkaroon agad ng plano this early (Senator Pacquiao called for a meeting at his residence. While Pampanga is still celebrating, we went already to his house because he is excited to see the growth and success of the league and he wants to already have plan this early)," Duremdes said in Tuesday's Philippine Sports Writers Association (PSA) Forum at the conference hall of the Rizal Memorial Sports Complex.

While Pampanga was a dominant force in the playoffs, including becoming the first team to sweep the finals, Duremdes noted too, how the Lanterns are the fifth different national champion in five seasons of the league so far.

Batangas was the inaugural champion followed by San Juan, Davao Occidental, and Nueva Ecija.

"Kung mapapansin ninyo ang MPBL talaga is an unpredictable league. Walang dominant teams. History-wise since our inaugural season wala pang nakapag-back-to-back championship. And ngayon ang magiging barometer naman ng mga teams yung Pampanga (If you'll notice MPBL is an unpredictable league. No dominant teams. History wise since our inaugural season, no team has yet to win back-to-back championships)," he said.

He said even last year's finalists Nueva Ecija and Zamboanga were both eliminated in this season's playoffs.

"Yun ang pinaka-exciting na part ng MPBL. Hindi mo alam kung sino ang mananalo (That's the exciting part of the MPBL. You don't know which team will win)," the PBA great said in the session presented by San Miguel Corporation, Philippine Sports Commission, MILO,

Philippine Olympic Committee, and the Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR).

"Nakita natin yung improvement and level playing field at yung quality ng mga players nag-improve talaga ng malaki (We have also notice the improvement and level playing field and the quality of players have improved a lot)," he added.

That perhaps has been the reason for the MPBL finally breaching the 1 million followers from its Facebook page.

"It was quite an achievement for the league," Duremdes said.

After the holiday break, Duremdes said the MPBL will hold its pre-season games twice - one in the North and one in the South, which will all be televised.

Duremdes said the MPBL is also looking to add more games to its schedule by next season, while two more teams have submitted Letter of Intent to join the regional league. (PR)

Ramos bags 3 silver medals for PH at IWF Grand Prix 2 in Qatar

The Philippines kicked off its campaign at the International Weightlifting Federation (IWF) Grand Prix II with three silver medals courtesy of Rose Jean Ramos in the women's 45kg category on Tuesday (Wednesday in Manila).

The 18-year-old pride of Zamboanga City had a total lift of 155kgs -- 70kgs in snatch and 85kgs in the clean and jerk.

The gold medals went to Won Hyon Sim of South Korea, who registered a total lift of 181kgs (82-99).

"Unang-una po, nagpapasalamat po ako kay Lord dahil hindi niya kami iniwan ng ate ko (Rosegie). Nagpapasalamat din po ako sa mga coaches at team ko po dahil palagi silang adiyang para sa akin, sinusupportahan nila kami (First of all, I thank the Lord because he did not leave my sister [Rosegie] and me. I am also thankful to my coaches and team because they are always there for me, they support us)," Ramos told the Philippine News Agency after the competition.

Samahang Weightlifting ng Pilipinas president Monico Puentevella was happy with the results.

"When our kids go out to represent the country in the international field, we always look forward to gaining medals or they don't go. It's as simple as that. We do not want to waste government money.

This is our task. This tourney is a qualifier for the Paris Olympics next year. Second to the last. But our main goal here is not just winning medals. Qualifying for the Olympics is our priority and so far, so good. By the end of this Grand Prix, we'll know our chances and it looks good for now," the former Philippine Sports Commission commissioner said.

"Thanks to PSC, SM Group, MVPSF, the parents, our SWP Board, and the coaches. To God be the Glory. This is just the first day. Hopefully, more to come. Better Christmas for our kids,"

Puentevella added.

Ramos, who joined the national training pool in 2018, won the World Youth Weightlifting Championships twice.

Last year in Mexico, she bagged the gold medals in clean and jerk (85kgs) and total (155kgs) and the silver in snatch (70kgs).

In Jeddah, Saudi Arabia in 2021, she ruled the snatch (67kgs), placed second in the clean and jerk (80kgs) and had the best total (147kgs).

Ramos, who studies at Mampang National High School, has been training with national coach Allen Jayfrus Diaz for the past seven years. (PNA)

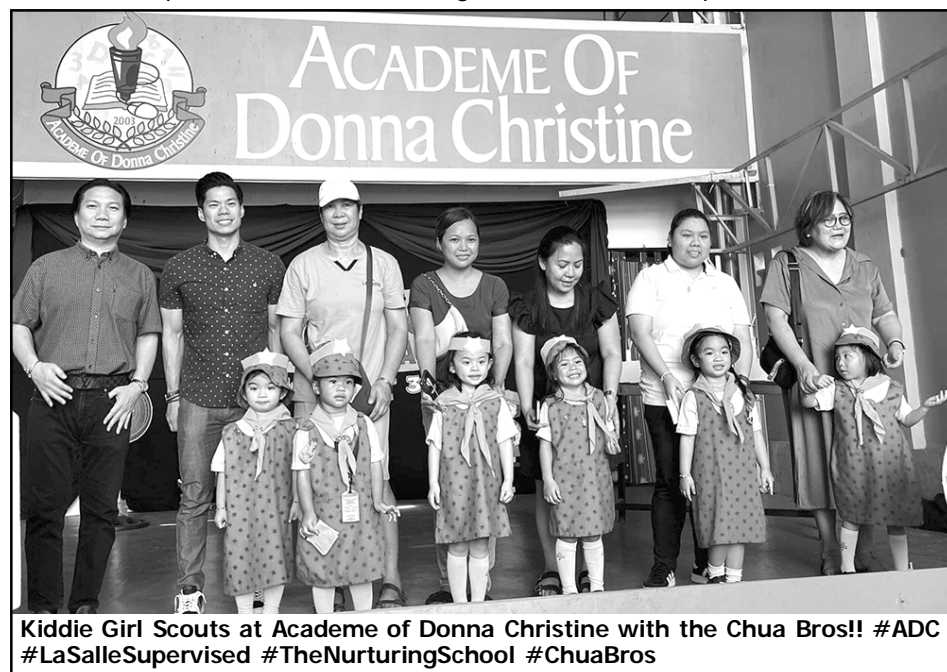

Moreover, Ms. Briton-Caya emphasized the role of OWWA in providing various benefits and services such as education and training assistance for

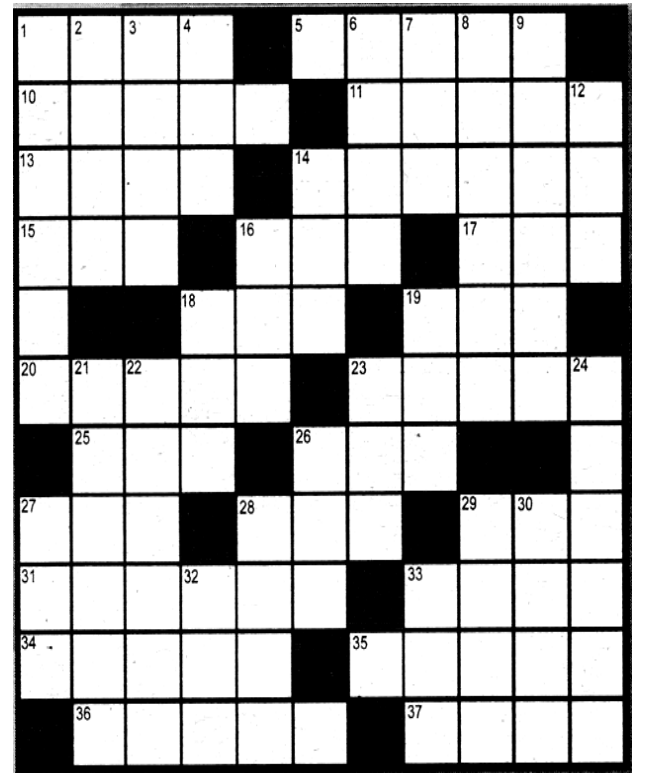
OFWs' dependents, health and wellness programs, and legal assistance for those facing challenges abroad.

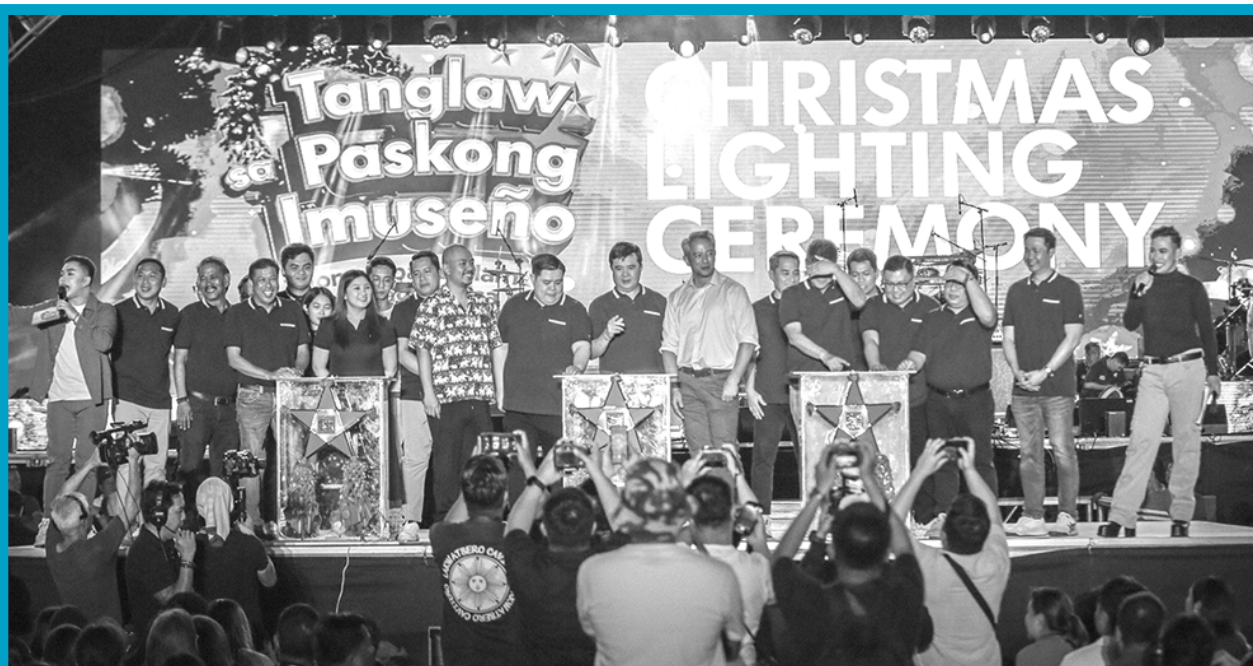

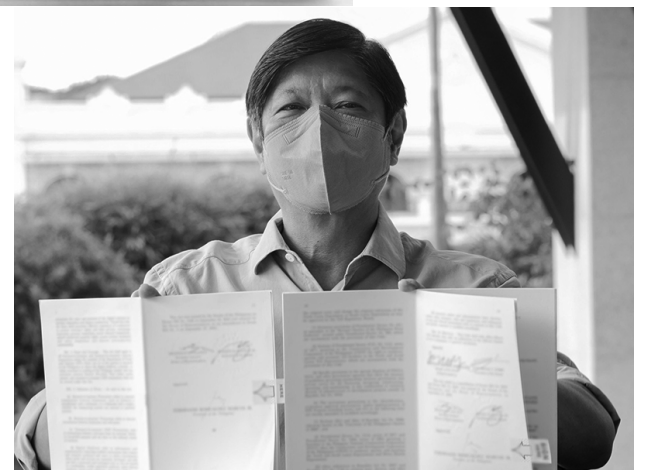
