DOH RECOGNIZES 'MARIJUANA' BENEFITS

NO less than Department of Health (DOH) secretary, Dr. Ted Herbosa, has recognized the benefits of medical cannabis or marijuana. A fast-tracked bill is in Congress for the legalization of its use.



Only few are now opposed to the passage of pending bills in Congress seeking to legalize the use of this medical cannabis as medicines. The recently concluded Joint Congressional Committee on Dangerous Drugs and unanimously Health approved that the bills be proposed forwarded to a technical working group, preparatory to submission to the Congress for deliberation during plenary session.

Dr. Marg Gem Mutia,

adult medicine specialist and founder of Philippine Society of Cannabinoid Medicine, said it's the first time ever that a DOH chief has recognized the medical cannabis and its benefits "unlike his predecessors."

Dr. Richard Nixon Gomez, an inventor, a scientist and general manager of Bauertek Corporation, the sponsor of the weekly Media Health Forum held every Monday, said the number of those opposed to legalize the use of marijuana, has lessened. With some 10 pending bills in Congress and Senate seeking to legalize the use of the medical herb or marijuana, he said that more and more evidence are gathered indicating its benefits.

Gomez said that the use of the controversial marijuana, should be looked at from a bigger and global perspective as more doctors, experts, scientists, politicians around the world advocate for its use, based on studies. The benefits are

SILANG, Cavite: A program intended to create awareness and share the correct method of preserving cultural properties, wood, paintings and monuments, among others, was launched here on Tuesday.

future ones. Events like this spread proper knowledge and the importance of our culture and history," the event organizers said.

The Materials Research Conservation Division of the NHCP sees public education as an important means of generating public awareness and appreciation in the field of conservation and restoration through seminars and training geared toward providing an interactive platform for stakeholders both in the public and private sectors.

The Conservation Goes to the Province (CGTTP) program is now in its 13th year and has been to Bacolod, Batanes, Naga, Dumaguete, Cebu, Bataan, Sorsogon, Iloilo and Sagada.

This year, the local government of Silang hosted the CGTTP-Cavite

on August 22-25 at the Function Hall of the Silang New Municipal Building in Barangay Biga 1.

Here, participants are given lectures on basic conservation methodology critical to heritage protection through a theoretical and hands-on approach and case studies from various conservation and restoration works by the NHCP.

During the training, participants are to be provided with six modules covering historic structures, paper and related materials, textiles, wood and wooden polychrome, metal, paintings, and other related conservation lectures on disaster risk management for cultural heritage, agents of deterioration, collection documentation, and the presentation of case studies. DOST upgrades IP school bamboo crafts through GRIND program



With the goal of empowering indigenous culture, the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) in region 10 upgrades Luyungan IP High School's bamboo crafts through the Grassroots Innovation for Inclusive Development Program.

The GRIND program is a pioneering initiative of DOST Region XI in partnership with the United Nations Development Program in the Philippines and the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (UNESCAP). Through this program, DOST-X aims to empower marginalized communities and build their resilience by developing and deploying grassroots innovations in Davao Region and, ultimately, countrywide.

Its main objective is to Identify and assess GIs that address significant problems in the communities among all regions. It also aims to provide a package of S&T interventions among grassroots innovators and communities responsive to the location-specific needs of the regions.

DOST-X has turned over an array of tools and equipment during the turnover on June 16, 2023 at the school's premises in Brgy. Bangcud, Malaybalay City. It was attended by DOST representatives, school administrators, teachers, and IP students. The event marked a significant milestone in the development of the school's bamboo crafts program and opened doors to new opportunities for the local community.

Better to be extra ready with disaster food banks and stockpiles isaster preparedness should not merely be

about readiness during a disaster; it means that a city or a municipality should remain prepared even when there is no disaster.

As a nation most vulnerable to climate change, natural disasters are inevitable, particularly with the annual onslaught of multiple typhoons. Year after year, we are inundated with news headlines of towns ravaged by strong winds and rains, with flash floods and storm surges destroying crucial infrastructure like roads and bridges. The result is a loss of power and communication, rendering entire localities on a standstill and homes uninhabitable for days

Within this grim reality, the distressing hunger, discomfort, and anxiety experienced by our fellow FIlipinos temporarily residing in cramped relief centers becomes painfully evident. This is a classic tale of how the government fails its citizenry.

Therefore, it's high time that we proactively address this perennial predicament even before any major disaster strikes again. Advanced preparation is paramount, given that swift action following a calamity is essential. Any wrong move or a snail-paced response could amplify an already disastrous situation.

To institutionalize this concept of readiness within our disaster management framework, one of the legislations from the House of Representatives is House Bill (HB) 8463. This bill seeks to "set up and construct disaster food banks and stockpiles in every province and urbanized city across the nation to speed up the delivery of relief goods and other supplies during calamities.'

The House passed the bill on its third and final reading with 274 affirmative votes.

Speaker Ferdinand Martin G. Romualdez said the proposal stemmed from the fact that the country is visited every year by more than 20 typhoons, which have become stronger due to climate change.

"This reality requires us to prepare for the eventuality of storms and similar calamities displacing residents of affected areas. We have to have a faster, more efficient, and a more effective system of responding to disasters and helping our people," he said. "A single life we can save through the timely delivery of medicine, food and critical items in the event of a calamity is worth more than the effort and money that will go into setting up these food and



Under the bill, the disaster food bank and stockpile shall "serve as the central repository of food, water, medicines, vaccines, antidotes, and other critical medical products, medical kits, portable power and light source, clothing, tents, and communication devices." The shelf life of these items should at least be two years.

Recognizing the importance of cooperation during disasters, the establishment of the stockpiles shall also be an inter-agency effort. This will be led by the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) and the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), with the participation of various departments and the concerned local government.

The NDRRMC shall "determine the locations of the

stockpiles, taking into consideration equitable distribution among regions, accessibility, safety and security from natural and human-induced disasters, and immediate release of the supply reserves in case

of a calamity or an emergency."

This proposed bill is commendable, reflecting a crucial step toward rectifying an alarming trend where our fellow citizens, who have already lost homes and livelihoods, are further neglected post-calamity. The era of procrastination and the lack of foresight must end. Preparedness is our immediate call, not only to mitigate the impact of a disaster's aftermath but also to stop the unnecessary loss of lives that could be prevented beforehand.

PGC extends health services in Silang

Of the 195 patients catered, 145 availed the free medical services,


while 50 received free dental extractions and preventive oral health care. They also received prescription medicines, multivitamins, mosquito repellent-lotion.

DOST OneLab's poster presentation in Vietnam highlights the role in ensuring food safety

To further promote the importance of the network in ensuring food safety, the Department of Science and Technology's OneLab project management team joined the Association of Analytical Communities (AOAC) SEA Section 2nd Annual Conference held on August 1-2, 2023, in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.



The team composed of the project leader and DOST IX Assistant Regional Director for Finance, Administrative Support and Technical Services, Ms. Rosemarie S. Salazar; Dr. Annabelle V. Briones, co-project leader and Director of Industrial Technology Development Institute (ITDI); and Mr. Admer C. Project Coordinator and Quality

and CPD Manager of ITDI led the poster presentation detailing the initiatives of the OneLab Network.

Titled "A Networking Success: The Role of the Philippines' DOST OneLab Network in Ensuring Food Safety for Both the National and International Markets," the poster presentation posited that many of the member laboratories under the OneLab Network come

from testing laboratories

Through the network, micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in remote areas of the Philippines, they said, can

which are being utilized to address the increasing needs from various stakeholders for testing of foods and food products to ensure safety and quality, meeting national and international requirements and standards.

> now have access to testing services to check if their food and food products are complying to quality requirements and are safe for consumption.

This innovative solution has, in turn, enabled MSMEs produce globally competitive food and food products that can penetrate the international market through the economies' Mutual **Recognition Arrangements** (MRAs), since the products are tested by accredited laboratories based on PNS ISO/IEC 17025:2017.

For years, the network has helped various sectors: (a) the regulatory bodies in the performance of their function to regulate foods and food products for the strict implementation Republic Act (RA) 10611 or the Food Safety Act of 2013; (b) the big companies and MSMEs which don't have internal quality assurance laboratories for their food quality and safety assessments, meeting requirements of their own customers; and (c) the policy makers for the development of food safety national and international standards from scientific data of the local settings in the Philippines.

They said that the DOST OneLab has been been influential not only in the monitoring of food safety and quality in the country, but as well as in the contribution to the development of food national standards through the technical expertise provided by DOST.

Pesticide residue as food safety issue in SEA countries

Aside from the poster presentation, Dr. Briones served as one of the panelists in a panel discussion on the "Needs of Pesticide Analysis in the Southeast Asia Region."

The discussion focused on pesticide residue being one of the major food safety issues in the Southeast Asian countries and on the discussion on the needs of pesticide analysis in the Southeast Asian region with the intention to support international trade.

Ms. Edna Callejas Mijares, RCh., MSc., CEO of Jefcor Laboratories, Inc., for the Philippines, presented "Pesticides Residues in Food and Food Products: Analysis and CODEX Standards for Maximum Residue Limits" which called for the harmonization standards by adoption of CODEX Standards as provided for in the Food Safety Act of 2013 and she also served as one of the panelists.



for physical, mental and emotional. "Ito ay tinatanggap na ng mga sports, athletic bodies, NBA. Tinatanggap na rin ng Olympics at iba pang athletic bodies at maraming hospital."

To this date, he said around 60 countries and counting, are prescribing the use of medical cannabis to their patients for various ailments.

Dr. Marq Gem Mutia meanwhile said that the use of medical cannabis has been going on for many years and the only "traditional" medicine that was available even during the time of national hero, Dr. Jose Rizal. It was, he said a "mainstream medicine" before its prohibition.

Around 100 ailments

and diseases could be treated with marijuana and it was clinically proven for chronic pain, chemotherapy associated with nausea and vomiting, multiple sclerosis and intractable epilepsy.

Dr. Camille Garcia, a clinical psychologist and CEO of the Clinic of the Holy Spirit, said that medical cannabis is also used for Parkinson's disease and Alzheimer's disease. She said that cannabis contains cannabidiol or CBD, which is one of the best medications for various ailments like psychosis, schizophrenia.

Meanwhile, Gomez brought good news to the forum on the status of the pending bills in Congress that led to the formation

of a technical working group (TWG) in the Senate.

He said, they discussed the contents of the bills and amended some and once done, this would be signed by the bills' authors and will be brought to the plenary for another discussion. It is in this stage that Gomez's group needs the help of various advocates and supporters.

Bauertek is a research, manufacturing and development company in Guiguinto, Bulacan, that has the capability to manufacture medicines from marijuana based on the specific formulation or needs of the patients.

is establishing the Women's International Network on Disaster Risk Reduction which recognizes women leading disaster risk reduction efforts in the Asia-Pacific region.

Moreover, SM Supermalls is advancing its commitment to advocate the implementation of the Magna Carta of Women and other gender-related laws by signing the memorandum of Understanding between the Philippine Commission on Women.

Based on the PCW's assessment of the implementation of the Magna Carta of Women from 2019 to 2021, mainstreaming gender in different sectors is heading north. According

to the 2023 gender global gap report, there was a growth in the Filipino female population enrolled and completed their education as well in basic and functional literacy rates

In the same report, the Philippines ranked 32 in terms of educational attainment with a gender parity score of 0.999 (with 1 denotes to high gender parity rate) covering all the key indicators. Gender parity pertains to the equal contribution of men and women in every aspect of private and public life. Furthermore, an escalation is noticeable in women occupying higher positions and women assuming leadership roles in office administration, peace and order, and politics.

On the other hand, the percentage of teenage pregnancy for women aged 15 to 19 has declined from 9% in 2017 down to 5% in 2022 based on the national demographic and health survey.

Gaining legislative support is another landmark to protect girls from sexual abuse and exploitation. Some of the newly passed laws under GAD include R.A. 1156 which prohibits child marriage, R.A. 11648 which raises the sex consent from 12 years old to 16 years old, and R.A. 11930 which is the antionline and sexual abuse of exploitation of children and anti-sexual abuse and exploitation materials Act.

As an 'AlaGAD' silver awardee, the DOST has attained level four (4) c o m m i t m e n t enhancement and

institutionalization in all entry points of the Gender Mainstreaming Evaluation Framework (GMEF) Organizational Assessment Tool.

"As we institutionalized gender mainstreaming in DOST, we continually build the organizational capacity to attain gender-sensitive policies, programs, projects, structures, and procedures," says DOST Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr. in his message.

The department demonstrates its commitment to gender and development principles through partnership with other agencies in developing and using renewable sources of energy in food production including the development women-friendly technologies and providing useful information and gender-sensitive technologies production, processing, and marketing food products.

Through its attach agencies, DOST continuously provides scholarships and career opportunities for women in science and supports start-ups through assistance in product development, packaging, marketing, intellectual property, and business guides. Women Micro-Entrepreneurs are also assisted through a resolution that engages Local Government Units to support their products.

Furthermore, DOST also established and actively operates its Gender Help Desk and produced and launched the use of DOST GAD KIT and modules in gender mainstreaming. As unified GADvocates, the capacity-building activities on GAD, as well as the GAD Focal point assemblies, were continuously conducted.

"Our department intends to develop science,

technology, and innovation policies that empower and support women and men in sustainable development. As ONE DOST, we will fight gender inequality to achieve the change we desire to our gender equality." This was affirmed by Sec.
