Powering adoption of electric vehicles

ust when mobility began increasing as the country recovers from Covid-19, the war between Ukraine and Russia -- two of the world's largest oil producers, sent economies tumbling after the massive increases in global crude oil prices that dribbled down to the local fuel industry.

Based on data from Statista, the average retail price of one liter of gas in the Philippines is now up by 36.9 percent in the first half of the year versus the same period in 2021, making it a huge challenge for the transportation sector which is one of the priority sectors for the development of the Marcos administration.


In his first State of the Nation Address, President Ferdinand R. Marcos said that one of his priority programs is developing the country's transportation industry through a better railway system. There were also statements assuring improvements in the mass transport system -one that is not only efficient but also eco-friendly.

For more than a decade now, the Philippine government has been promoting the use of electric vehicles (EV) with the goal of creating a more sustainable environment for the country. In 2006, the government issued Executive Order 488 to support the manufacturing of EVs. This effectively reduced the tariff rate for EV components, consequently allowing EV manufacturers to import at a more affordable price.

This was further supported by Republic Act 11697, or the EV Industry Development Act (EVIDA), which provides a national policy framework to develop the electric vehicle industry in the Philippines.

There is increasing interest in EVs in the country, and the pandemic years were a testament to this when transportation and mobility were limited to keep the virus outbreak at bay.

As compared with conventional vehicles, EVs are more eco-friendly as they do not emit carbon



dioxide that is harmful to the environment and are considerably more economical. A report said that the energy consumption cost of using an EV or electric public utility jeepney (EV-PUJ) is roughly 39 percent as against a diesel-fueled conventional PUJ.

Many companies have also incorporated EVs into their sustainability agenda. One of which is the Manila Electric Company (Meralco), the largest distribution utility in the Philippines.

Over the last two years, Meralco has launched its Green Mobility Program which aimed to electrify its entire vehicle fleet. As of this writing, Meralco has successfully converted the entire fleet of its Metro Manila Business Centers into Evs.

To support the program, Meralco installed five fast chargers in strategic locations across its franchise area and looking to more than double the number over the next three months. Four more charging stations will be put up at its Power Tech facility at the Meralco Compound which can cater to almost all major commercially available protocols to date. It is also expected to feature a vehicle-tohome bidirectional charging station that will allow customers to use their EVs to supply power to their appliances.

Technology-wise, new models continue to evolve. According to Meralco Chief Sustainability Officer Raymond Ravelo during the recently concluded 10th Philippine EV Summit, new models

now are able to reach over 800 kilometers on a single charge -- roughly the distance between Pasay City and Banaue, Ifugao, and back, whereas EVs could barely run 100 kilometers on a full charge a decade ago.

In addition, Ravelo says that EVs have improved greatly, especially as lithium-ion battery pack prices are now down by already 90 percent from over \$1,200 per kWh in 2010 to just around \$130 last year. This has consequently driven down the price of an EV with a comparable range to almost a third of price points a decade ago.

Compared to neighboring countries such as Thailand and Singapore, the Philippines' development of the EV industry is still relatively slow. This is where government participation plays a very crucial role.

EV industry acceleration will happen given enough government support through policies as well as the provision of subsidies or incentives. Manufacturers will be encouraged to ramp up production, thereby bringing down the prices and generating more jobs.

Just as the whole world goes in the same direction, EV adoption in the Philippines is inevitable -- it is just a matter of when. Best that we adapt early on, and educate ourselves and others on the benefits of an electrified and green future. (By Joe Zaldarriaga)

Cavite provincial, local governments recognized in Competitiveness Summit



TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) - The provincial government of Cavite and several cities and municipalities received recognition in the recently concluded 10th Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Summit held at the Philippine International Convention Center (PICC).

This year's summit with the theme: "A Decade of Excellence: Championing Innovation to Sustain Competitiveness" highlights Innovation, being the 5th Pillar of Cities and Municipalities Competitiveness Index (CMCI), a vital key to a more efficient, sustainable, and productive locality. The Provincial Government of Cavite ranked second Competitive Province

after Rizal province, a big jump from 5th place in 2021.

Likewise, two local government units in the province were also recognized for competitiveness: the Municipality of General Emilio Aguinaldo as Top 1 Most Competitive in Economic Dynamism (5th - 6th Class Municipality) while the city of Tagaytay as Top 3 Most Competitive in Government Efficiency (Component Cities).


Meanwhile, the city of Dasmariñas ranked Top 7 Component City, and the municipality of Carmona ranked Top 8 Component Municipality.

Rankings of Cities and Municipalities are based on the sum of their scores on 5 Pillars: Economic Dynamism, Government Efficiency,

Infrastructure, Resiliency, and Innovation. Provincial rankings are based on population and an income-weighted average of the Overall scores of cities and municipalities under a province.

The CMCI is an annual ranking of Philippine cities and municipalities, a total of 1,634 LGUs in all, and was developed by the National Competitiveness Council through the Regional Competitiveness Committees (RCCs) with the assistance of the United States Agency for International Development. A Bucket of Hope in Penablanca DOST R2



Water and sanitation are proven to have a major impact on public health. It gives people time, hope and joy. A chance for them to access equal opportunity to reach their full potential. However, the challenge remains evident in various far-flung communities in our country and in the region.

One of the affected areas related to this problem are sanitation and hygiene, water quality, appropriate technology and clear health indicators. It was really hard for everyone in the community to walk long distances just to get water. In addition, they are still unsure if it is clean enough for their consumption and to secure their safety.

As practiced, women usually have the responsibility of fetching water. This activity can be a dangerous, timeconsuming and physically demanding task for them. The image of women and children carrying heavy containers of water from far distances is really unforgettable, much more so when heavy rains come, and the roads are slippery and dangerous to pass.

Moreover, women have specific hygiene needs. Specially on the access to sanitary products and disposal systems to manage their menstrual hygiene and pregnancy.

With this, the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Region 02 through the program Community Empowerment thru Science and Technology (CEST) geared towards establishing and improving the water management of these far-flung communities in Cagayan Valley.

The DOST-CEST program is a package of S&T interventions that aims to build empowered, progressive, and resilient communities. CEST is DOST's response to the government's whole of the nation approach in support of reaching the marginalized sectors like farmers, fisherfolks, indigenous people, women's organizations, and of those residing in the Geographically Isolated and Disadvantaged Areas or GIDAS.

One of the beneficiaries of CEST is Sitio Amilan in barangay Baliuag, Penablanca Cagayan. One of the reasons the area was chosen is because of their lack of access to safe drinking water and adequate sanitation.

Residents in this area outsource water from streams and springs accessible only through the pace of the mountain. Thus, the

scarcity of water is experienced especially during summertime, and also a challenge during the wet season due to the slippery trek. Through the CEST program, the community will be given access to clean and potable water. This is also one of the goals of the DOST to promote health and sanitation that will serve as an avenue of opportunities for safe water and other domestic uses of water in the Region.

DOST R02 in partnership Pentur Farmers Agriculture Cooperative funded a total of P445,000 for the provision of a water distribution system to the community.

On October 14, 2022, the turnover of the funds was led by the Assistant Regional Director for Field Operation Services Engr. Sylvia Lacambra together with Science Research Specialists Ms Rowena Guzman and Engr. Benjamin Nicdao and Project Assistant Mr. John Benedic De Asis.

This project will solve the sufficiency and easy access of water supply in the area most especially the women in connection with their specific hygiene needs and personal use.

Moreover, this will be a great benefit to lessen the risks of

DTI Rizal through Negosyo Center Antipolo awards PPG livelihood kits in Antipolo City



The Department of Trade and Industry Rizal, through Negosyo Center Antipolo, distributed livelihood kits to 107 beneficiaries of the Pangkabuhayan sa Pagbangon at Ginhawa (PPG) Program on October 10 2022 in Sports Hub, Barangay San Isidro, Antipolo City. PPG is a post-disaster response livelihood seeding and entrepreneurship development program of DTI which aims to assist individuals and families affected by fire incidents and other calamities, including health disasters like the COVID-19 pandemic, to recover and/or start their businesses.

The program started with Consumer Advocacy for Rizal Entrepreneurs seminar. Ms. Concepcion Ramos, OIC-Chief of the Consumer Protection Division-Rizal, led the discussion. She covered the different types of sales promos and how to apply for a sales promo permit. She also discussed how and where to file a consumer complaint.

DTI-Rizal OIC-Provincial Director Cleotilde Duran, Rizal Vice Governor Reynaldo San Juan Jr, and Antipolo City Mayor Casimiro "Jun" Ynares represented by his wife, former Mayor Andrea "Andeng" Ynares led the distribution of livelihood kits to 107 beneficiaries from the different barangays of Antipolo City.

The livelihood kits a warded include packages for sari-sari store, salon/parlor, and barbershop.

program, stated that it is one of the government's interventions, particularly for micro, small, and medium enterprises affected by the COVID-19 pandemic. The kits, which include materials, equipment, and initial stock, will assist them in starting or expanding their businesses.

Bryant Kim An, the president of PCCI Antipolo, gave the beneficiaries a final message.

He also pushed the recipients to sustain their enterprises by using the livelihood assistance that was given to them.

Also present during the program were BDD Chief Sharon Dioco, STIDS Marlene De Luna, NC Antipolo Business Counsellor Daryl Andres, and AnTIPO OIC Amalia Engalla.
