Naic Pawikan Conservation Facility releases 78 sea turle hatchlings

TRECE MARTIRES, Cavite (PIA) - The Pawikan Conservation Facility located in the coastal town of Naic released 78 Olive Ridley (Lepidochelys Olivacea) sea turtle hatchlings back to their natural sea habitat in Barangay Labac.

The activity was led by Councilors Tere Puno, and Eimeren Nazareno together with Naic Tourism Head Lady Anne Lopez.

According to Barangay Labac Chairman Roger Bilugan, more hatchlings are scheduled to be released to the sea in the next few days as the breeding season starts.

Chairman Bilugan shared that the barangay was one of the areas that were severely damaged by severe Typhoon Paeng on October 29, 2022.

The hatchery facility with more than 2,000 eggs during the onslaught of the Dennis Abrina)

typhoon was not spared, and more than 300 Olive Ridley sea turtle eggs were affected in the nesting

"Last night, three turtles came to lay their eggs here at the facility, two of them with tags and the other without a tag," said Bilugan.

Turtles are tagged once they have laid eggs in the hatchery. An egg takes about 60 days in the hatchery before it finally hatches and returned to its ocean habitat.

Meanwhile, One Pawikan donated 30 tonner bags to create a revetment wall to hold and lessen erosion of the nesting areas and central hatchlings.

The Labac Conservation Facility was established to protect sea turtle eggs which are now considered an endangered species. (RBF/PIA-Cavite with reports from

PBBM meetings, tie-ups in Brussels to yield investments, jobs for Pinoys

MANILA — President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s business meetings on the sidelines of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN)-European Union (EU) Commemorative Summit will yield more investments and jobs for Filipinos.

Department of Foreign Affairs (DFA) Assistant Secretary Daniel Espiritu made this remark on Friday, saying the President will meet with the business community and have one-on-one meetings with corporations looking to expand their presence in the Philippines.

On the sidelines of the ASEAN-EUCommemorative Summit in Brussels, Belgium, the President will have the opportunity to expand on trade and investment policies during the business roundtable with the EU and European corporations.

Espiritu said there would also be networking among Filipino and European businessmen.

"Hopefully, for this networking, the Filipino businessmen will be able to come up with deals with their E u r o p e a n counterparts," he said.

On the President's

m e e t i n g w i t h multinational consumer g o o d s c o m p a n y, Unilever, the DFA official described it as vital since the firm intends to establish a new state-of-the-art manufacturing facility for personal care products in Cavite province.

"So expansion of investments ito 'no to the tune of P4.7 billion. Now it is expected to generate at least 130 projected employment for the Philippines," Espiritu said.

The chief executive is also expected to meet with a shipbuilding and navigation and logistics company that seeks to develop a shipyard with an investment of P1.5 billion, which will create 500 to 600 direct and indirect jobs.

An infrastructure and renewable energy company, which intends to invest in the renewable energy sector in the Philippines, would also meet one-on-one with the President.

The chief executive is also expected to meet with a wholesale market and international I ogistics hub management company which intends to establish agrologistics at the New Clark City that will build and operate a wholesale market for fresh products with an organized and efficient

food supply and value chain.

Apart from these one-on-one meetings, there will also be a meeting with the business sector within the framework of the ASEAN-EU dialog partnership relations.

The President is expected to participate

at the C-Suite or CEO Suite Luncheon for the EU-ASEAN Business Summit and at the 10th ASEAN-EU Business Summit during his trip to Belgium.

The chief executive is expected to deliver his remarks at these two events.

"So this will be a very busy trip for the President, and we hope that this will redound to a lot of benefits for the Filipino people, not only for ASEAN," Espiritu said. (PND)

800k worth of wildlife saved by DENR CALABARZON and CIDG Laguna

Laguna - The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) CALABARZON, through its Enforcement Division (ED), Licenses, Patents and Deeds Division (LPDD), assisted the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) Laguna PFU in a 10-hour joint wildlife buy-bust operation at Sitio 4, Barangay Oogong, Sta. Cruz, Laguna last November 18, 2022.

The joint operation was done in response to the request for assistance of the CIDG on an alleged illegal wildlife trading operation in Calamba City, Laguna.

Recovered from the operation were 185 heads of various exotic wildlife species of Reptiles and Arachnids with an estimated market value of more or less Php 800,000.00.

Confiscated wildlife includes Ball Python (Python regius), Emperor Scorpion (Pandinus imperator), and Mexican Rose Tarantula (Aphonopelma Pallidum) which are

classified as Appendix II in the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora

Other non-CITES confiscated wildlife were Leopard Gecko (Eublepharis macularius), and adult and juvenile Bearded Dragons (Pogona vitticeps).


According to the LPDD, the illegal wildlife trader is a holder of a Certificate of Wildlife Registration for pet hobbyist purposes only and not for commercial trade.

All confiscated wildlife species were turned over to the Regional Wildlife Rescue Center in Calauan, Laguna for custody. Likewise, proper criminal charges will be filed against the suspect for violating Republic Act No. 9147 also known as the Wildlife Resources Conservation and Protection Act.

Govt works for, not against Filipinos MANILA, (PIA) - Penology.

Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Secretary Amenah Pangandaman has reminded police cadets to ensure that they let people know that the government is "working for them and not against them."

Pangandaman made this call on Monday in her speech during the Distinguished Visitors Program of the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) at Camp General Mariano N. Castañeda in Silang town, Cavite province.

She said their duty as uniformed personnel is to serve as the nation's "vanguards of peace and order, safety and security."

Pangandaman assured the police cadets that the DBM fully supports the PNPA's vision to be a worldclass center of excellence in public safety education.

"Our pursuit of reform-oriented service towards public trust is also evident in the 2023 proposed national budget which was crafted to ensure that no one will be left behind - from our public servants including our uniformed personnel to the public we are sworn to protect," she said.

She also expressed her full support to the PNPA's Cadetship Program to develop professional, morally upright and dedicated public safety officers imbued with the values of justice, integrity, and service.

Under the proposed national budget, the DBM has allocated a total of P191.85 billion for the PNP.

A total of P27.79 billion was allocated the Bureau of Fire Protection while P22.34 billion was allotted for the Bureau of Jail Management and

Pangandaman was accorded arrival honors composed of an allfemale battalion sized contingent during the event.

PH, Japan experts strengthen climate change resiliency in the Philippines

Japanese experts are working to better prepare the Philippines from threats of climate change by discussing strategies on how to mitigate the adverse effects of flooding.

The Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), through its Unified Project Management Office Flood Control Management Cluster (UPMO - FCMC) headed by Project Director Ramon A. Arriola III, partnered with Japan's Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism - Water and Disaster Management Bureau (MLIT - WDMB) in organizing a seminar titled "Seminar on Climate Change Perspectives in Managing Rivers and Floods".

Aside from MLIT and DPWH, also present during the seminar were representatives from the Department of Environment and Natural Resources -Forest Management Bureau

MANILA - Filipino and (DENR - FMB); DENR -National Mapping and Resource Information Authority (DENR -NAMRIA); Department of Science and Technology -Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (DOST -PAGASA); Climate Change Commission (CCC); National Economic and Development Authority (NEDA); and National Irrigation Administration (NIA).

DPWH Assistant Secretary Antonio V. Molano, Jr., in his opening remarks, urged the participants to reflect on how to capitalize the diversity of functions and mandates of their respective agencies to assess and improve current climate change adaptation strategies of the Philippines.

The seminar at Bayview Park Hotel Manila served as a venue for participating Philippine agencies to further hone their existing knowledge in addressing climate change by learning from Japan's experience and success in river and flood management as pointed out by the Embassy of Japan Minister Daisuke Nihei in his

According to Minister Nihei, Japan's achievements in climate change management are visible and integrated into ongoing disaster prevention projects and initiatives with the Philippines which includes the Pasig-Marikina River Channel Improvement Project Phase IV; Coastal **Engineering Capacity** Development for DPWH personnel; flood risk management projects in Cavite Industrial Area and Cagayan De Oro City; flood control master plan study in Davao City; and the feasibility study for the Parañaque Spillway Project.

The MLIT also outlined the extract of the Kumamoto Initiative for Water which is a joint statement and declaration to address water challenges and transformation towards a quality-oriented society avowed by 18 heads of states from Asia and the Pacific during the 4th Asia-Pacific Water Summit (APWS) last April 2022.

For its part, DPWH UPMO - FCMC presented its Flood Risk Management Master Plans while the DPWH Bureau of Design (DPWH - BOD) detailed its flood control planning design responsive to climate change.

Other topics discussed at the seminar included the "Observed Climate Trends and Projected Climate Change in the Philippines" by DOST - PAGASA; "Sea Level Rise: Is It Climate Change of Land Subsidence?" by DENR -NAMRIA; "Climate Change Programs and Policies in the Philippines" by CCC; and "National Greening Program Towards Climate Change Mitigation and Adaptation" by DENR - FMB. 

With seven silvers and three bronzes, the Philippines finished third behind Vietnam (17 golds and one silver) and Cambodia (one gold, one silver and four bronzes).

The Cambodian wrestlers have shown their determination to win more medals as host of SEAG.

Last June, they pocketed three gold, three silver and one bronze medals at the Wrestling and Beach Wrestling Championships of Thailand.

They have also improved a lot since training under Iranian coach Komeil Ghasemi in 2021. Ghasemi won the freestyle 120kg gold medal at the 2012 London Olympics. (PNA)
