Calabarzon workers get second tranche of wage hike

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — Minimum wage earners

in Calabarzon will get an increase of P23 to P48 in their daily take-home pay following the implementation of the

second tranche of a wage order.

The Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board (RTWPB) IV-A announced on Tuesday, January 3 that Wage

Order IVA-19 previously signed in May 2022 took effect last December 30.

Minimum wage earners in the region have already received an additional P3 to P49 daily increase during the

first tranche of the wage order last year.

The new minimum wage rate in the nonagricultural sector is set to P470 in the extended metropolitan area which includes the cities of Bacoor, Imus, and Dasmarinas in Cavite; Binan and San Pedro in Laguna; Antipolo City, Cainta, and Taytay in Rizal.

Component cities and first class municipalities will receive a P28 wage increase or P429 daily

Wage rate in the second and third class municipalities workers was set to P390 while the rate in the fourth to 6th class municipalities was set to P350.

Meanwhile agricultural workers in the extended metropolitan area and component cities will now receive P429 daily; workers in first class municipalities will get

In order to improve bureaucratic efficiency, the DICT launched the e-Gov Super App, the country's first one-stop platform for local and national government services that will streamline processes and transactions and ensure ease of doing business for Filipinos.

To ensure social protection, the DICT pushed for the passage of the SIM Card Registration Act, monitored more than 1,000 cybersecurity threats, conducted sessions on Data Privacy Act, and launched Cybersecurity Awareness programs.

The DICT also listed in its year-end report its plans and targets for next year.

for digital infrastructure, investment promotion, as well as improvements in bureaucratic efficiency.

Under its digital infrastructure thrust, the DICT plans to complete the Broadband ng Masa's Luzon Bypass Infrastructure (LBI) Phase 1 in the first half of 2023, launch more than 15,000 free Wi-Fi sites, and improve satellite connectivity

These include plans with Starlink and Satellite Systems Providers and/or Operators (SSPOs).

> To promote investments, the Digital Cities Program will set up Information Technology and **Business Process** Management (IT-BPM) locations in 31 cities by 2025 to generate jobs in the countryside.

The DICT will also push for the development and implementation of interagency initiatives such as the National ID of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), iLGU of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Vaxcert of the Department of Health (DOH), E-Commerce of the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI), and OFW App of the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW).

The DICT will also play a significant part in the implementation of the SIM Card Registration Law, being the agency mandated to collect SIM Card registries from public telecommunications entities (PTEs) and maintain the records.

And to protect the country from online threats, the DICT will develop the National Cybersecurity Plan for 2023

P390 daily; those in second to sixth class municipalities will receive P350 daily.

Those in the retail and service establishments with not more than 10 workers will receive an acrossthe-board increase of P23 giving them a P350 daily wage rate.

The minimum wage rate is given to employees who work for not exceeding eight hours a day.

According to the RTWPB IV-A, the wage hike is the government's response to the lower purchasing power of the peso, two-tiered wage system, poverty threshold, impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, comparability of wages vis-a-vis benchmark regions, and the dispersal of industries across the region. Wrestler Lobreguito eyes 2023 SEA Games gold

MANILA - After sa wrestling (I stopped winning the Philippines' only gold medal at the Southeast Asian Championships held from December 16-18 at the Phumin Phnom Penh University in Cambodia, wrestler Alvin Lobreguito is setting his sights on another golden performance in the 2023 SEA Games.

Lobreguito bagged the men's freestyle 57kg championship after earning the highest points in the roundrobin competition. He beat Thailand's Nattawut Kaewkhuanchum (10-0), Vietnam's Khac Huy Phung (11-3) and Cambodia's Sophors Soeun (10-0) but lost to Indonesia's Zainal Abidin, 3-4.

"Masaya ako kasi hindi ko expected na mananalo ako. Lahat ng nakalaban ko magagaling. Nag-focus lang ako sa kung ano ang dapat kong gawin (I am happy because I did not expect to win. All my opponents were very good. I just focused on what I need to do)," said the airman first class in the Philippine Air Force in an interview on Friday.

In his 11-year career as an athlete, Lobreguito earned a bronze medal at the 2017 Asian Indoor and Martial Arts Games (AIMAG) in Ashgabat, Turkmenistan. He also has three SEA Games medals under his belt two silvers (2019 Manila and 2022 Vietnam) and one bronze (2013 Myanmar).

The 30-year-old Lobreguito was born and raised in Bagong Silanganan, Quezon City. The youngest among three siblings was a college sophomore taking up entrepreneurial management at the Quezon City Polytechnic University in Batasan when he decided to quit.

"Tumigil ako ng pag-aaral para makapag-concentrate schooling so I can concentrate on wrestling)," shared Lobreguito, who started training at the age of 14 under the supervision of former national playing coach Violeto Agustin, a second cousin from his father's side.

"My goal is to win the gold medal in the 2023 Cambodia SEA Games. It is achievable with proper training and exposure," said Lobreguito, who is busy preparing for his wedding in January next

Aside from one gold, the Philippines also pocketed five silver and five bronze medals in the Cambodia tournament, which served as preparation for next year's SEA Games.

Ronil Tubog (men's freestyle 61kg), Michael Vijay Cater (men's Greco Roman 55kg), Jason Baucas (men's Greco Roman 72kg), Jiah Pingot (women's freestyle 50kg) and Mariane Mariano (women's freestyle 59kg) bagged the silver medals while Jhonny Morte (men's freestyle 65kg), Jeferson Calingayan (men's freestyle 70kg),

Margarito Angana Jr. (men's Greco-Roman 60kg), Jefferson Manatad (men's Greco-Roman 87kg), and Maribel Angana (women's freestyle 53kg) secured the bronze medals.

Noel Norada (men's Greco Roman 63kg), Joefer Callado (men's Greco Roman 57kg), Neonards Cervantes (men's Freestyle 79kg), Aliah Rose Gavalez (women's Freestyle 55kg) and Rea Grace Cervantes (women's Freestyle 57kg) missed the podium.

Aside from Lobreguito, Morte, Tubog, and Pingot and Margarito Angana Jr. were also Vietnam SEAG medalists.

Meanwhile, Vietnam, who ruled wrestling when it hosted the SEAG last May, topped the medal tally board with 18 golds, 11 silvers and one bronze.

Indonesia was second with six golds, nine silvers and three bronzes followed by Cambodia (3-3-13), Philippines (1-5-5), Thailand (1-2-6) and Singapore (1-0-2). Laos failed to win any medals.

Cambodia's threegold performance in the pre-SEAG showed its determination to win more medals in the tournament proper slated May 5 to 17.

Last June, the

Cambodian wrestlers grabbed three golds, three silvers and one bronze at the Thailand Wrestling and Beach Wrestling Championships.

The biq improvement can be credited to Iranian Komeil Ghasemi, the 2012 London Olympics freestyle 120kg gold medalist who has been training the Cambodian wrestlers since 2021. (PNA)

Baguio keens 'Batang Pinoy

BAGUIO CITY - This summer capital has retained the top spot in the annual Batang Pinoy sports competition for athletes 15 years and below held in Vigan City, Ilocos Sur.

In a press release coursed through the City Public Information Office, city sports division head Gaudencio Gonzales said Baguio finished with a 31-30-39 gold-silver-bronze

medal output, ahead of closest rivals Pasig City (22-12-14) and Quezon City (21-10-15).

Gonzales said archery produced 11 gold, 8 silver, and 9 bronze medals,



taekwondo brought home an 8-4-6 medal tally, and Muay Thai with 5-3-4.

The city sent a 278person delegation to the more than one-week sporting event from Dec. 17 to 22.

Gonzales said nineyear-old Jathniel Caleb Fernandez and Chass Mhaiven Colas led the archery haul with six and three-gold medal win, respectively.

Wushu, arnis, and swimming teams contributed one gold each.

Baguio also bagged the championship in 2018 and 2019, the last two editions before the onset of the coronavirus pandemic which resulted in the cancelation of the games in 2020 and 2021.

Gonzales said a total of 17 events were played either in-person or virtually.

Among the events conducted virtually were arnis, dancesport, judo, karate, Muay Thai, Pencak silat, taekwondo, and wushu while in-person events were archery, athletics, badminton, chess, cycling, table tennis, swimming, weightlifting and game sports.

Aside from the championship trophy and two "Pursigido" (persistent) Awards from Milo, the city also received PHP3 million in check for the biggest medal haul. (PNA)

DPWH heeds PBBM directive to build bridges, farm-to-market roads to make life easier for farmers, common folks

MANILA - The high-quality and Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) has heeded the directive of President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. to make life easier for common folks as the agency continues to build, upgrade and rehabilitate bridges, flood control structures and school buildings.

Through a budget provided by the Department of Agriculture, the DPWH built some 75 kilometers of farm-to-markets roads from July to November this year as part of President Marcos' pledge to help farmers transport their harvest to public markets.

To ensure the unhampered transport of goods and services in the provinces, the DPWH built, upgraded, and rehabilitated a total of 112 bridges, 650 flood control structures as well as 2,575 school buildings for use of public school students.

The DPWH has also played an active role in disaster response like what it did in the aftermath of the magnitude 7.3 earthquake in Abra where the agency deployed thousands of personnel to help in the search, rescue and relief efforts.

In its report to Malacañang, the DPWH said it deployed more than 7,000 personnel as the government responded to several disaster areas brought about by earthquakes and the successive typhoons that hit the country this year.

Aside from personnel deployment, the DPWH also dispatched 1,711 pieces of equipment and cleared 168 road sections in multiple provinces from Luzon to Mindanao.

Responding to the President's call to build

efficient infrastructure, the DPWH said in its accomplishment report that it has so far constructed, maintained and rehabilitated 1,105 kilometers of roads from July to November this year.

The DPWH's major infrastructure projects include the Cavite-Laguna Expressway, **NLEX-SLEX** Connector Road, Central Luzon Link Expressway, Cagayan de Oro River Flood Management project, Samar-Pacific Coastal Road and the Mindanao Growth Corridor Road Sector Project.

Also on the DPWH list are road network development projects in conflict-affected areas in Mindanao, Laguna-Lakeshore Road Network, Bataan-Cavite Interlink Bridge, Panguil Bay Bridge, Samal Island-Davao City Bridge and the Davao Bypass City Construction project.

The agency's key priority programs under the administration's 8point socioeconomic agenda include a traffic decongestion program through the construction of highstandard highways and expressways, bypasses, diversion roads, flyovers and interchanges.


The DPWH is also actively involved in the Integrated and Seamless Transport System Program such as improving the Daang Maharlika, construction of inter-island linkages and mega bridges, and connecting gaps along national roads.

Through its Rural Roads Convergence Program, the DPWH will construct and upgrade access roads leading to tourism destinations, industry and trade corridors, RORO ports, airports and railway stations.

To support the Agri-

infrastructure Support Program, farm-tomarket and farm-to-mill roads will be built, based on the DPWH program.

The DPWH also has programs on flood management, water more livable, communities. (PND)

CAAP's statement on the MC power supply failure

PASAY CITY -- The Communications, Navigation, and Surveillance/Air Traffic Management (CNS/ATM) System was a P10.8-billion project financed by the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) that was completed on October 2017.

The CNS/ATM system provides various computer-aided safety measures in Air Traffic Control (ATC), and enhances safety through reduction of controller/pilot workloads and human errors. The new ATM System introduced Air Traffic Flow Management (ATFM) and Air Space Management (ASM) functions, which optimize the use of

airport capacity and the efficient use of airspace, hence minimizing delays and allowing more flexible and userpreferred air-route selection.

Previously, CAAP only used three radars which are stationed at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport in Pasay, in Clark, Pampanga, and in Tagaytay, Cavite to manage the Philippines' air traffic.

CNS/ATM system, the country now has 13 radars (NAIA1, Clark, Tagaytay, Aparri, Laoag, Cebu-Mt. Majic, Quezon-Palawan, Zamboanga, NAIA2, Mactan, Bacolod, Kalibo, and Davao) covering around 70% of Philippine air space. Additionally, with the

introduction of the Automatic Dependent Surveillance - Contract (ADS-C) and the Controller-Pilot Data Link Communications (CPDLC), the CNS/ATM is able to cover 100% of the remaining oceanic airspace, hence increasing air traffic safety and capacity in the oceanic region of the Manila FIR.

The system was inaugurated on 16 January 2018 and With the new commenced comprehensive operations on 26 July 2019.

The incident that resulted in the loss of power in the system was due to a problem in the system's electrical network, with its uninterruptible power supply (UPS), which is to be used as backup

power supply, also failing. The main cause of the power supply problem is still being determined and is subject for investigation. The CAAP's Aerodrome and Air Navigation Safety Oversight Office (AANSOO) will be tasked to investigate the incident.

CAAP recognizes that the system is already behind when it was first used in 2019 and has made recommendations to the President on improving the country's air traffic management system.

Despite the circumstances, CAAP, alongside concerned authorities, has ensured that no aircraft or passengers were harmed. CAAP is grateful to its air traffic management officers, air navigation system officers, and other staff involved in ensuring that the country's air traffic
