

# Makabagong imparastruktura, tungo sa bagong Pilipinas

Ina prubahan ni Pangulong Ferdinand R.

Marcos Jr. ang 194 programang pang-imparastruktura na nagkakahalaga ng humigit kumulang P9 na trilyon bilang bahagi ng Build Better More Program ng administrasyon.

Ayon sa pangulo, layunin nitong mabigyan ng mas maginhawa at mas maunlad na buhay ang iba't ibang sektor ng ating lipunan. Dagdag pa niya, "Ito ang landas na ating tatahakin tungo sa isang bagong Pilipinas."

Niliinaw ni Pangulong Marcos na sa 194 proyekto na nasa listahan ng NEDA, 123 ang inisyatibo ng kanyang administrasyon samantalang ang ibang mga proyekto naman ay nasimulan na noong patapos na ang termino ni dating pangulong Rodrigo Duterte. Aniya, ang isang proyekto ay dapat ituloy kung ito ay maganda, kapaki-pakinabang at dumaan sa masusing pag-aaral.

"Ang imparastruktura ay kaunlaran lalo na't kasama nito ay masusing pag-aaral. Sa ganitong paraan, walang masasayang na pondo dahil ang bawat proyekto ay mapapakinabangan ng mamayan," saad ni Pangulong Marcos.

Ang mga proyekto ito ay may kinalaman sa digital connectivity, flood control, irigasyon,

suplay ng tubig, kalusugan, at enerhiya. Bukod pa ito sa mga tren, highway, at tulay na gagawin.

Sa isang press briefing na ginaganap noong ika-14 ng Marso, inilatag ni DPWH Secretary Manuel M. Bonoan ang estado ng ilan sa mga proyekto ng administrasyon. katulad ng unang segment ng NLEX-SLEX connector na malapit nang maging handa para sa inaugurasyon.

Nakalinya na rin para sa inaugurasyon ang flood mitigation projects sa Cagayan de Oro, at ilang road projects sa Mindanao.

Kabilang naman sa mga proyekto na ipatupad ng Department of Public Works and Highways mula July hanggang December 2022 ang 1,500 kilometrong national roads at local roads sa bansa.

Ayon kay Secretary Bonoan, may listahan din sila ng mga tulay na handa na para sa groundbreaking at naipresinta na nila ito kay Pangulong Marcos.

Mayroon namang mga proyekto ng magiging handa na para sa groundbreaking bago dumating ang SONA ngayong taon. Kabilang dito ang mga gusali para sa National Kidney and Transplant Institute; ang pediatric and adult's specialty center ng Philippine General Hospital; Philippine Children's Medical Center; at Philippine Cancer Center.



Nabibilang naman sa listahan ng mga kasalukuyang ginagawa ang isang tulay na magkokonekta sa Cavite at Bataan. Ayon kay Bonoan, ang tulay ay may habang 32 kilometro

Ayon kay Pangulong Marcos, ang pinakaunang benepisyo na matatamo ng bansa mula sa mga proyekto ito ay pagkakaroon ng trabaho. Aniya, ang mga ito ay magbibigay ng mas maraming hanapbhay para sa ating manggagawa, laborer, at skilled workers.

"Noong pandemic ay higit 1.4 million jobs ang naibigay ng infrastructure projects sa atin. Ito ay karagdagang 1.4 milyon na pamilyang Pilipino na may pagkain sa mesa

kaya't ang pag-aprubahan ng 194 projects na ito sa iba't ibang bahagi ng bansa ay may dala dala ring milyon-milyong trabaho para sa ating mga kababayan," paliwanag ng pangulo.

Sinabi rin ni Pangulong Marcos na ang mga proyekto ito ay makatulong na

masulosyunan ang problema sa trapiko. Ayon umano sa pag-aaral ng Japan International Cooperation Agency, mahigit P3 bilyon ang nawawala sa Pilipinas kada araw dahil sa naaksayang oras sa trapiko.

"Sa pagpapaganda

ng ating mga railway system, hangad nating hikayatin ang mas maraming tao na gumamit nito at mabawasan ang mga pribadong sasakyang saka. S a pagpapalawak ng ating mga highway, pagtatayo ng mga

bagong tulay at kalsada, magkakaroon ng bagong daluyan ang ating trapiko," paglilinaws ng pangulo.

Ang ikatlo naman aniyang benepisyo ay para sa food security at pagbaba ng presyo ng pagkain. Sinabi ni Pangulong Marcos na "sa pamamagitan ng mga infrastructure project para sa ating irrigation system, masisigurong may maasahang sistemang patubig ang ating mga sakahan. Ang patuloy ring pagpaparami ng farm-to-market road ay magbibigay ng mas maraming oportunidad para sa ating magsasaka. Ito ay mga bagay na maaring makapagbabaw ng presyo ng bilihin mula sa ating mga bukid."

Ikaapat na benepisyo ay para naman sa pagtugon sa climate change. Paliwanag ng pangulo, "Mas inihahanda tayo ng makabagong infrastructure sa mga epekto ng climate change. Lagi naming ipinapaalala sa mga magtatayo ng mga bagong infrastructure na isipin lagi ang climate change. Mayroon tayong mga flood management project na nailatag. May mga infrastructure na gagawin para patibayin ang ating water supply

system."

Makakatulong din umano sa digitalization ng ating bansa ang mga proyekto nito. Naniniwala ang pangulo na ang internet ay mahalagang bahagi ng a raw - a raw na pamumuhay. Ito aniya ay lalong magbibigay ng kabuhayan at oportunidad sa bansa at magiging tulay na magbubuklod sa ating sambayan.

"It should connect markets and involve more people in the digital economy. Hindi lang pang local kundi sa global market din," dagdag pa ni Pangulong Marcos.

Ikaanim na benepisyo ay sa ukol naman sa energy sector. Sinabi ng pangulo na "upang magkakaroon ng mura, sapat at maasahang supply ng kuryente, sa pagtatayo ng iba't ibang energy infrastructure gaya ng power plant, magkakaroon tayo ng mas maraming pagkuhan ng kuryente. Layon ding maraming ang mga lugar na wala pang ilaw, bilang ating patuloy na misyon na makamit ang 100% electrification ng buong Pilipinas."

Pampitong sektor naman aniya na makikinabang ay ang turismo. Ayon kay Pangulong Marcos,

napakaraming magagandang lugar sa Pilipinas na kailangan lang gawing accessible upang dayuhin ng mas marami pang mga turista. Ito aniya ang magdadala ng mas maraming kabuhayan sa mga lalawigan ng bansa.

Para sa ika-walo at huling benepisyo, naniniwala ang pangulo na ang moderno at mas matibay na a infrastructure ay maghihikayat ng mas

maraming investor sa bansa.

"Magandang mga daungan ng barko para sa mga cargo ship, maasahang energy supply saang dako man ng bansa, connectivity sa pamamagitan ng mga communication towers at magandang mga kalye at paliparan upang magiging accessible ang mga bawat lugar. Iyan ang mga hinahanap ng mga investor na nais magsimula ng negosyo sa ating bansa,"

paliwanag pa niya.

Karamihan aniya ng mga proyekto nito ay maari lamang sa Public Private Partnership. "Marami rin dito ay magkakaroon ng sapat na pondo bunga ng ating mainit na pakikipag-ugnayan sa iba't ibang bansa. Kung kaya't kasama ng NEDA, minabuti rin nating i-adjust ang guidelines ng ating joint venture para naman mas maging kaakit-akit ang investment dito sa Pilipinas," paglilinaw ni

Pangulong Marcos.

Dagdag pa niya, "Ang infrastructure ay kaunlaran, dala-dala ay mga benepisyo ng magpapaganda, 'di lang ng ekonomiya kundi ang antas ng kalidad ng pamumuhay ng bawat Pilipino. Ipagbubuklod ang sambayan, pisikal man o digital, gagawa ng paraan. Ang matitibay, moderno at de-kalidad na infrastructure ay daan tungo sa isang bagong Pilipinas." (ARB, PIA-CPSD)

Austria, OIC-Tanza Municipal Agriculturist, Councilor Emilio Torres, Chairperson-Committee on Agriculture and Fisheries, and Mr. Felix Joselito H. Noceda, of Agricultural Program Coordinating Office - Cavite.

The techno-demo for onion production was a collaboration project among the farmer-cooperator, the Cavite Farmers' Association, OPA, and the private companies that provided the seeds and fertilizer. CFA

purchased the Red Thunder seeds from Chia Tai Corp. while the Super Pinoy variety was purchased by Mr. Edwin Ferrer. OPA provided technical assistance and vermicast while Gemini Agri-Farm Solutions Corp. company provided free foliar fertilizer. These partner private companies likewise

provided technical assistance in monitoring the growth of the onions.

Other techno-demo farms for onion production in Cavite are located in the municipalities of Silang, General Mariano Alvarez and Maragondon. --- PICAD



## PDEA destroys P20B worth of illegal drugs

**MANILA, (PIA)** — The Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) on Thursday destroyed illegal drugs valued around P20 billion.

According to PDEA, this is the most number of dangerous drugs, controlled precursors and essential chemicals

(CPECs) they have destroyed, so far.

The agency said the illegal drugs are made up of evidence confiscated from various anti-drug operations conducted by PDEA, in collaboration with their counterpart law enforcement and military units.

PDEA conducted the destruction of the 3.7-tons (3,746,081.07 grams) of illegal drugs worth P19,965,441, 929.59, at its Integrated Waste Management, Inc. (IWMI), in Barangay Aguado, Trece Martires City, Cavite.

Pieces of drug evidence are destroyed

by thermal decomposition or thermolysis which involves breaking down chemical compounds using extreme heat.

The event is witnessed by key officials of PDEA, and representatives from the Department of

— Performance literature festival "Performatura" goes back to live and on-site activities happening at Cultural Center of the Philippines (CCP) from March 31 to April 2, from 10:30 a.m. onwards, at the Tanghalang Ignacio B. Gimenez (CCP Black Box Theater).

With the theme "Performatura Goes Pop," the three-day event presents performances, poetry readings, multi-arts workshops, literary talks, spoken word sessions, poetry contest, film screening, book launches, book and art fair, and interviews with renowned writers.

Led by its festival director Dr. Vim Nadera Jr., the first day of festival — dubbed Unbox@Blackbox — focuses on literature on social media in its morning session while afternoon session celebrates the National Women's Month.

There will be a special screening of "Brutal," a film directed by National Artist for Film Marilou Diaz Abaya and written by National Artist for Film and Broadcast Arts Ricky Lee, who will do a talk back session after the screening. Moderated by Patricia Holgado, this film event is co-presented by the CCP Film, Broadcast and New Media Division and the Film Development Council of the Philippines.

The second day of the festival centers on the art of spoken word, headlined by the Ampalaya Monologues, Remote Performa-

tura events will also take place on April 8. The Pinoy Reads Pinoy Books Book Club will discuss the life and works of Lualhati Bautista. Venue is to be announced soon. It is free and open to public, interested individuals may get in touch with Facebook page of the PRPB.

Dubbed Araw ni Balagtas, Performatura pays tribute and celebrates the 149th birth anniversary of Francisco Baltazar on the last day of the festival. National Artist for Literature Virgilio Almario speaks about the significance of Bataan in the life of Balagtas; followed by performances by teachers and students of Bataan High School for the Arts, and multi-arts workshops at 2pm.

Capping the festival will be the KamPerformatura's offering of poetry and performances by the youth participants, which will kickstart the Tanghal Makata 2023, the Performatura-born competition.

The closing segment is presented by GSIS Museum, LIRA, and Unyon ng mga Manunulat sa Pilipinas (UMPIL).

Multitalented artist Mimi Tecson will hold a mini-exhibit at the lobby of the CCP Tanghalang Ignacio Gimenez. Her art materials include book pages.

Thirty artists, writers, and publishers, organized by Pia Perez of The Indie Publishers Collab PH and Mark Ghosn, will sell their works at the venue on Days 1 and 2. Artists and entrepreneurs from the Unbox team will sell their works at the venue on Day 3.

**MANILA (PIA)** — More than five decades have passed, but the story of a significant event that is considered the major flashpoint that ignited the Moro insurgency in the Philippines—the Jabidah Massacre—is never forgotten.

During its 55th year on Saturday, March 18, the Bangsamoro Government, led by the Ministry of Public Order and Safety (MPOS), honored the Tausug and Sama men who were unceremoniously killed at Corregidor Island in Cavite in 1968.

MPOS Minister

Hussien Muñoz underscored that this commemoration is not meant to ignite emotions of the past, but rather an initiative towards healing, reconciliation, and unity of all the people in the country.

"The story of the Jabidah Massacre alone would entail the seeds of the modern Bangsamoro struggle. It is in this cause that we need to honor the lives lost on that fateful day, along with countless Moro lives, in order to establish the Bangsamoro region," he added.

Muñoz disclosed some of the significant impacts of the annual event, saying that it is a form of moving forward for a peaceful and systematic approach toward the transformation of our political systems, conflicts, and other conditions that may have been at the root of the abuses.

The BARMM leadership recognizes the memories of Bangsamoro history, including the Jabidah Massacre, that laid and strengthened the foundations for peace and strong solidarity.

Chief Minister Ahod Balawag Ebrahim honored the young Tausug and Sama brothers who died that day, emphasizing: "We remember the inhumane acts committed to them, and it is our duty to continue remembering their valor and attribute this freedom we are all enjoying today to them. Their sacrifices paved the way for the realization of our dreams of a united and self-governing Bangsamoro."

He also urged the Bangsamoro officials and employees to continue supporting the building of a stronger government that demonstrates just, peaceful, and progressive Bangsamoro communities all across their homeland.

"Let this painful part of our history be a reminder that the Moro people stood up against oppression and marginalization. It may have been five decades ago, but we will always remember," the Chief Minister reminded. (BIO / PIA - 10/Lanao del Sur)
