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Provincial Government of Cavite conducts Tabletop Exercise for Magnitude 7.2 Earthquake response

As part of its ongoing commitment to strengthening disaster preparedness and response, the Provincial Government of Cavite, through the Office of the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer (PDRMO), successfully conducted a Tabletop Exercise on June 19, 2025 held at the Carmona Operations Center in Barangay Maduya, City of Carmona. The exercise simulated a Magnitude 7.2 earthquake with Intensity 8 ground shaking, carried out in line with the 2nd Quarter National Simultaneous Earthquake Drill, reinforcing the province's proactive approach to disaster risk management.

The activity brought together key responders and stakeholders from various government agencies, including the Office of Civil Defense (OCD), City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) of Carmona and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (MDRRMO) of Silang and General Mariano Alvarez (GMA), as well as representatives from the Office of the Provincial Engineer (OPE), Office of the Provincial Health Officer (OPHO), Office of the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Officer (OPSWDO), Department of Education (DepEd), Department of Social Welfare and

Protecting the Future of Pi: A Call for Unity and Education

Dear Global Pioneers,

I hope this message finds you well. Over the past few days, I've been deeply engaged with work and haven't had many opportunities to share updates. Today, I want to take a moment to highlight our current priorities and the direction we must

take moving forward.

Our core focus now must be educating and rebuilding confidence among pioneers in the Pi Network. This is not just about awareness—it's about laying a solid foundation for the long-term success of both Pi and our shared GCV.

I understand that many of you are eager to access and use your Pi as soon as possible. But I encourage you to pause and reflect: After years of mining, is it truly worthwhile to sell your Pi for a few hundred or

even a few thousand dollars? What happens after the money is gone? Who will support you during unexpected financial hardships?

Consider the many people who once had stable incomes but eventually fell into poverty due to job loss or medical issues. If you sell all your Pi now, what will you have left when your family needs you most?

This is why we must take action—not through monetary investment or years of uncertainty, but through unity and education. If 10 million pioneers each share the GCV message with just 5 to 10 a day across social platforms, we could rapidly shift awareness and perception. We can easily have 30 million pioneers with long-term vision.

At present, the road to a successful OM is blocked by a lack of consensus. Many pioneers are focused only on short-term profits, unaware of the true potential of Pi. Despite the existence of 25+ DApps on the Mainnet, there is still no unified price, and most merchants value Pi at just a few dollars—some even less—due to the price on exchanges hovering around \$0.50.

This trend is damaging. The continued price decline stems from pioneers treating Pi solely as a free commodity to sell without a low bottom line. The rush for KYC, migrations, and speculative trading only

accelerates this downward pressure. Recently, the migration of 30 million Pi in one day caused a \$0.12 price drop. Some analysts believe that if this continues unchecked, Pi could fall to \$0.12.

With over 330 million Pi scheduled to be released from long-term lockups, and most pioneers holding large amounts, the influx to the market will further strain the price. At the same time, much of the messaging surrounding Pi focuses only on the technical milestones, leading many to believe that technology alone guarantees success. This is a dangerous misconception.

Now, more than ever, we need to rally together. If we truly want to protect our lifestyle, income, and future, we must embrace the GCV movement and advocate for our shared vision. The CT has deliberately left space for us to lead this initiative. It's our turn to step up.

If we remain silent, the vision behind Pi will fade. But if we rise, speak, and educate, we can transform Pi into a tool for lasting global impact—not just another cryptocurrency.

Let's unite and shape our future—together.

The Global GCV Movement: A New Chapter in the Decentralized Economy of the Pi Network

The Global Consensus Value (GCV) movement, with its foundational vision of 1 Pi = \$314,159 USD, continues to gain momentum. It stands as one of the boldest and most community-driven initiatives in the emerging world of decentralized digital economies.

Built on the belief that value should be defined by the people who mine, build, and use the currency, GCV has evolved into a global, multilingual, multicultural network. Together, pioneers are shaping a digital economy rooted in principle, transparency, and collective ownership.

Ms. Doris Yin, the founder and ideological leader of the GCV movement, has been instrumental in building this foundation. In 2023, she authored "The Pioneer's Handbook", which includes 99 educational topics—a comprehensive curriculum now used globally to train GCV leaders and ambassadors. Her work not only provided a framework for the movement but instilled it with purpose and clarity. As she puts it:

"If Pi is not protected by reasoning, actions will lack direction. If not guided by principles, its future can easily be manipulated."

On June 19, 2025, Ms. Lumari, Executive Director and Chair of the Global GCV Committee, released the global report for the Buy-Back Campaign, titled "Two Cups of Coffee – For Legacy and Humanity."

This campaign invites Pioneers worldwide to reclaim Pi from speculative exchanges by buying a symbolic amount—equivalent to two cups of coffee—and transferring it to their wallet. This simple act has become a powerful expression of community ownership and resistance to market manipulation.

As of the latest report, a total of 9,829,013.31 Pi has been successfully reclaimed globally. The countries with the largest reported buy-back amounts include China with 8,593,000 Pi, India with 1,000,000 Pi, the Philippines with 65,218.40 Pi, Turkey with 59,840 Pi, Indonesia with 49,026 Pi, Vietnam with 31,326 Pi, and Thailand with 5,000 Pi. Other participating countries include France (4,550 Pi), Palestine (3,690.53 Pi), Argentina (1,761 Pi), Nigeria (1,446.29 Pi), and the Arab region (105 Pi).

Cameroon has also just reported a new contribution of over 30,000 Pi reclaimed in recent weeks, becoming a notable addition to the growing list of active nations. Many more countries are still compiling and submitting data, as the campaign continues to spread rapidly across continents.

The campaign's official message reads:

"Two cups of coffee, I give with pride,
For 200 years of hope worldwide.
For legacy, for humanity's climb,
For six generations, beyond our time."

GCV – The Shield Before Open Mainnet

As the Open Mainnet draws near, GCV is no longer just an idea—it is a protective framework for the Pi Network community. It is not merely about establishing a price—it is about defending the ecosystem from speculative forces.

The global strategy includes five key actions:

Withdraw Pi from exchanges to create scarcity and reduce the influence of speculative pricing.

Call upon developers worldwide to build decentralized applications (dApps) that support GCV-based transactions—specifically at the rate of 1 Pi = \$314,159 USD. These dApps should be community-driven, user-friendly, and capable of recording, verifying, and transparently reporting real transactions at GCV. Their purpose is to establish a trusted, visible, and independent commercial system that does not rely on centralized exchanges.

Train GCV Ambassadors across nations, based on the 99-topic leadership handbook authored by Doris Yin, to spread GCV values systematically, strategically, and ideologically.

Build an ecosystem of GCV merchants, where businesses and vendors accept Pi payments either fully at the GCV rate or using a hybrid model (part fiat, part Pi), creating a real value flow between buyers and sellers.

Establish a transparent system to record and verify GCV transactions, making them publicly accessible (on blockchain or through community-led verification), so they serve as historical proof of Pi's real-world value ahead of the Open Mainnet.

PH backs two-state solution to Israel-Palestine conflict, says Palace

MANILA – The Philippine government supports the two-state solution to address the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, Malacañang said on Thursday.

"Ang Pilipinas po ay laging sumusuporta sa two-state solution to independent states na Palestine at Israel na mag-co-exist side by side na kinikilala ang kani-kaniyang borders (The Philippines has always supported the two-state solution to the independent states of Palestine and Israel to co-exist side by side, recognizing their respective borders)," Palace Press Officer Claire Castro said in a press briefing.

Castro's statement was in response to Palestinian Ambassador to the Philippines Mounir Anastas' call on the Philippines to convince Israel to resolve

the humanitarian crisis in Gaza.

In an interview with GMA Integrated News on Tuesday, Anastas said the Philippines should "apply some pressure" to ensure that Israel respects the humanitarian question in Gaza and the West Bank.

The government also supports a lasting and comprehensive peace in the Middle East under the UN Charter and relevant UN Security Council Resolutions.

Castro said the Philippine government also supports a "lasting and comprehensive" peace in the Middle East, in accordance with the United

Nations (UN) Charter and relevant UN Security Council Resolutions.

"Kaya po nananawagan din po ang bansa natin, ang ating pamahalaan para masiguro po na wala sanang tigil, unhampered delivery ng tulong sa mga Palestinian nating mga kaibigan (That is why our country, our government, is also calling for the uninterrupted, unhampered delivery of aid to our Palestinian friends)," she said.

"Pero patungkol po sa kaniyang panukala, ide-defer po natin ito sa DFA (But regarding his proposal, we will defer it to the DFA [Department of Foreign



Affairs])."

During his intervention at the 2nd ASEAN-Gulf Cooperation Council Summit in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia on May 27, President Ferdinand R.

Marcos Jr. called for adherence to international humanitarian law amid the Gaza crisis.

Marcos expressed deep concern over the escalating humanitarian

crisis in Gaza, seeking the protection of civilians, especially women and children, as well as the facilitation of humanitarian assistance to all those who are in need. (PNA)

Narra pushes back: Palawan communities hold forum against coal, highlighting decades-long resistance

Quezon City, Philippines — The Philippine Movement for Climate Justice (PMCJ) joined the “Forum on No to Coal” in Narra, Palawan on June 24, 2025 to stop the construction of a long-resisted coal plant in the area.

“The Palaweños have been resisting the existing coal plant and all destructive projects in the province for over a decade,” PMCJ Luzon Coordinator Erwin Puhawan said. He added that in the first 15-MW coal-fired power plant built in the area, local communities complained that D.M. Consunji, Inc. (DMCI) failed to conduct public scoping and public hearings or provide clear science-based evidence of the coal project's impact.

When this coal-fired power plant was first proposed in Aborlan in 2012, many were against the project and filed legal interventions and cases against DMCI. They

asserted that the proposed power plant would threaten the province's biodiversity and the local residents' health. However, in August 2023, DMCI completed the construction of the plant in Brgy. Bato-Bato, Narra, Palawan.

Another 15-MW coal-fired power plant was proposed, and the communities had long resisted it.

In 2013, they successfully halted the proposed power plant. However, just recently, locals reported news about DMCI pushing this second dirty plant project again.

“Following the news of the proposed coal plant, the Environmental Legal

Assistance Center (ELAC) found that several barangays, including Batang-Batang, Malinao, and Aramaywan, were not informed, and there were no prior public consultations regarding the coal project.

It was also revealed that no Free, Prior, and Informed Consent (FPIC) had been obtained from Indigenous communities, violating their legal and cultural rights, the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act (IPRA), and Presidential Decree No. 1586 on the environmental impact assessment system.

For provinces like Palawan, the proposed expansion is a national

emergency. The province is home to hundreds of species of flora and fauna, many of which are endemic and threatened by habitat loss and the climate crisis,” PMCJ National Coordinator Ian Rivera said.

Rivera argued that Palawan has been a designated UNESCO Man and Biosphere Reserve since 1990. “This is the last ecological frontier of the Philippines. This alone is enough basis for why coal plants have no place in Palawan,” Rivera added.

From 2020 to 2024, Narra lost 305 hectares of its natural forest during the construction and operation of the coal plant in Narra. One noticeable effect of Palawan's worsening climate and environmental

condition is the recent flooding in the province. In February 2025, a shear line brought torrential rains to Palawan.

“DMCI's history of steering around public opposition is obvious foul play. Worse, the company continued to build business in an ecologically sensitive and protected area despite the legal interventions and questioning of their project's process. This expansion is a deliberate act of climate injustice that disrespects the legal processes, the voices of local communities, and the planet. DMCI's business model is based on greed and destruction,” Puhawan stressed.

Rivera highlighted the Consunji-led Semirara Mining and Power Corp. wreaking havoc in Antique,

“This big corporation burns coal and is about to mine, as DOE and DENR gave nod to the environmentally-destructive project. This only proves that the government is not serious enough on just transition. In a period of climate emergency, it does not make sense why the government is still pursuing this unchanged path of allowing greater use of coal. It signals their misplaced priority on profits over the people and the planet, which falls on deaf ears among the alarms raised by communities affected by dirty and harmful projects.”

DOTr to consult economic team on proposed P1 fare hike

MANILA – The Department of Transportation (DOTr) will consult the Marcos administration's economic managers regarding the proposed PHP1 provisional fare hike, Secretary Vince Dizon said Thursday, amid rising clamor from transport groups reeling from big-time fuel price hikes.



In a Palace briefing, Dizon said the government is weighing the concerns of public utility drivers and operators while also protecting the riding public from additional burden.

“Pag-uusapan po natin iyan, ‘no? Kasi alam ninyo naman na kailangan natin balansehin din iyong epekto ng pagtaas ng pasahe sa ating mga commuters, sa ating mga kababayan (We will have to discuss that, because we need to balance the impact of any fare hike on our commuters and fellow citizens),” Dizon said.

“Kailangan pag-aralan natin at i-balanse natin ng mabuti iyan, so iko-konsulta na po natin iyan sa ating economic team para makakuha tayo ng guidance (We need to study and carefully balance this, so we'll consult the economic team to get guidance).”

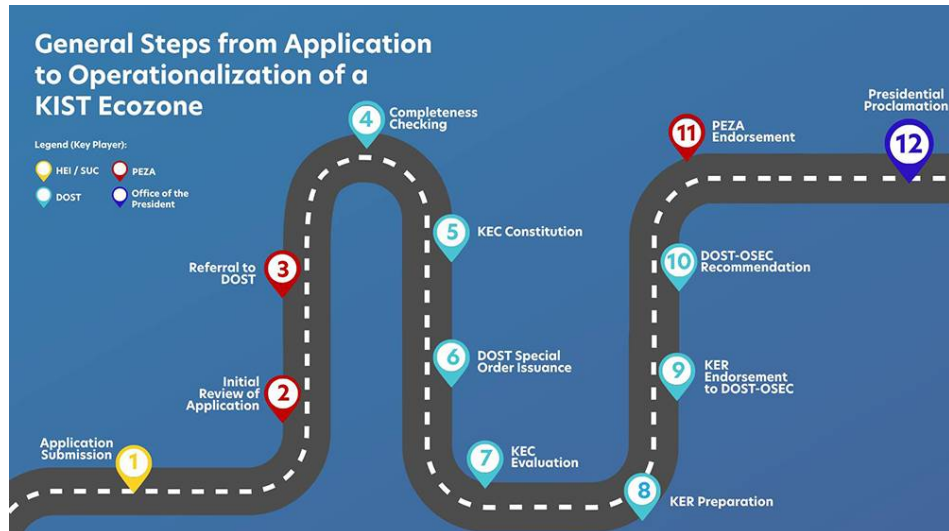
Transport groups, including Pasang Masda, Alliance of Transport Operators and Drivers Association of the Philippines (Altodap) and Alliance of Concerned Transport Organizations, have been lobbying for a fare hike due to rising oil prices, which the Department of Energy attributed to the conflict between Israel and Iran.

To mitigate the effects of rising fuel prices, the government is preparing to roll out a PHP2.5-billion fuel subsidy program for jeepneys, buses, taxis, ride-hailing services and delivery vehicles.

Dizon said a total of 1,132,407 drivers are expected to benefit from the subsidy program, including 258,712 public utility vehicle drivers; 723,695 tricycle drivers; and 150,000 delivery riders. **(PNA)**

DOST and PEZA Complete Nationwide Orientation of 33 HEIs to Propel Innovation-Driven Regional Economic Growth through KIST Ecozones

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST), in collaboration with the Philippine Economic Zone Authority (PEZA), successfully completed the Virtual Orientation Series on the Knowledge, Innovation, Science and Technology (KIST) Ecozone Program. Held every Tuesday from May 13 to June 17, 2025, the series aimed to guide higher education institutions (HEIs) in preparing their applications to become registered KIST Ecozone Developers.



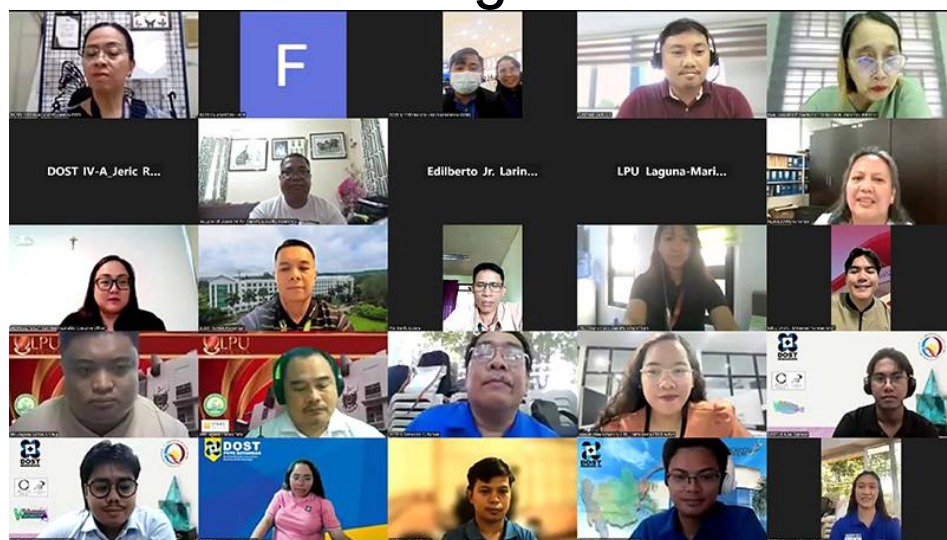
The KIST Ecozone Program is a strategic initiative by DOST and PEZA that seeks to establish special economic zones within HEIs. Formally recognized through PEZA registration and Presidential Proclamation under Republic Act 7916 (Special Economic Zone Act), these university-based ecozones will foster interdisciplinary collaboration, promote technopreneurship, and accelerate

commercialization of research and development outputs. By linking academe, industry, and government, these ecozones are envisioned to drive innovation, create quality jobs, support high-value industries, and contribute to advancing the goals of the Philippine Development Plan 2023–2028.

The virtual orientation series was part of the joint effort of DOST and PEZA to operationalize the

DOST-PEZA Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2023-001 and DOST Memorandum Circular No. 001 s. 2024, which provides the policy and procedural framework for the establishment of KIST Parks/Ecozones across the country.

The series opened with strong support from national leaders. DOST Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr., PEZA Director General Tereso O. Panga, and DOST Undersecretary



for Regional Operations Sancho A. Maborang underscored the transformative potential of KIST Ecozones in turning HEIs into innovation hubs, strengthening university-industry linkages, and driving inclusive, regional economic growth.

Each weekly session offered comprehensive guidance on the KIST Park/Ecozone application process, including the requirements and evaluation procedures. The sessions also featured an open forum where participants from HEIs engaged with resource persons from both DOST and PEZA.

Representing DOST were Ms. Emelita P. Bagsit (Regional Director, DOST CALABARZON) and Engr. Melvin P. Jusi (Project

Development Officer IV, DOST Office of the Undersecretary for Regional Operations). From PEZA's Ecozone Development Department, participating officials included Mr. Ludwig O. Daza (Department Manager), Ms. Liza S. De Vera (Division Chief III), and Ms. Nancy F. Vargas (Project Evaluation Officer IV). Together, they addressed technical, procedural, and policy-related concerns, and offered practical guidance to support HEIs in navigating the KIST Ecozone application and development process.

Throughout the six-week program, a total of 33 HEIs/SUCs were successfully oriented nationwide, with participation from 17 DOST

Regional Offices and select local government units across various regions. The orientation series marks a critical step in accelerating the implementation of the KIST Ecozone Program and building a more innovation-driven economy.

With sustained collaboration and growing interest among academic institutions, DOST and PEZA remain hopeful that by 2028, at least seven KIST Parks will be proclaimed and/or established across the country—anchoring a future where science, technology, and innovation serve as the foundation for inclusive, sustainable, and globally competitive regional development. **(By Jeric H. for Luzon, Eduardo Cardona, publisher of Rizal Voice Publication, and Dina Diaz, publisher of Tarlac Insider Weekly Newspaper; Board of Director for Visayas, Giecel Albar, publisher of Akeanon News Publishing Services; and Re-elected Board of Director for Mindanao Elpedio Bermas Soriano Jr., publisher of Peryodista Publications, and Joseph Denmarc Miranda Avila, publisher of Eagles Journal.

Held concurrently with its national elections and the mid-year general assembly, bearing the theme 'Fighting Fake News as a United Mission,' National Press Club President Leoniel Abasola, Dr. Lily Lim, and the Presidential Task Force on Media Security (PTFoMS) Undersecretary, Joe Torres Jr. extended their message of support towards the organization, expressing their immense gratitude to PAPI for their enduring partnership over the years.

In his speech, Torres ensured that the status of the late-Chairman Emeritus of PAPI, Juan "Johnny" P. Dayang Sr., is

taken into careful investigation to obtain justice in its right order. Dayang was shot and killed in the evening of April 29 by now-identified gunmen at his house in Kalibo, Aklan, where he served as its former officer-in-charge mayor after the 1986 Philippine Revolution.

Additionally, veteran broadcast journalist and re-appointed Secretary of the Presidential Communication Office (PCO), Jay Ruiz, showed his full support to the outgoing President, Nelson Santos, and PAPI by attending the event and delivered a speech that empowered wise and critical decisions among the publishers in the age of digital media and the need to forge a collaborative effort in fighting relentlessly with fake news, hence imposing penalties to fake news peddlers.

"Kailangan tayo magkaisa, labanan natin itong fake news, at i-impose na dapat sila rin magbayad ng buwis, magkaroon [ng] kahit na papaano regulasyon o pananagutan kung yung plataporma mo ay

nagagamit sa fake news," Ruiz mentioned.

"Maganda po yung relationship ng PAPI at ng PCO, at 'yan po ay magpapatuloy habang nandito po kami. Tiyak po 'yan. Kasi nais naming ipa-abot sa mamamayang Pilipino - hindi lang dito sa Metro Manila, kundi sa buong Pilipinas na ang gobyernong Marcos ay para sa tao. Magtulungan po tayong ipa-abot ang mga programa, aktibidades, at mga polisiya ng gobyerno," he added.

Hence, alongside the assembly and elections, PAPI then paid tribute to the 90th birthday of Dayang where his son, Consul General to Turkey Juan "Jed" Dayang Jr., expressed his heartfelt thanks to the organization through a video message emphasizing that remembering is not enough - if his father were truly honored, shall the memories, contributions, and the legacy left by his father, not only with the organization, but also all over the country that had helped flourish the press freedom, must be carried forward.

"He believed that journalism was never about comfort, it is about

courage. So I ask of you now, let's not reduce his death to a headline, let's not treat this tribute as a farewell - let it be a signal, a challenge, a commitment to speak when it is dangerous, to write when it is unpopular, to never trade truth for

access, or silence for safety," Dayang said.

In high hopes for the new board members, Jed Dayang also mentioned in his video to continue fighting for press freedom, and moving forward, as their family will always be there to support the

organization, just like what his father used to do.

The newly elected officials are set to take office after their oath-taking, which is yet to be announced by the new board, and will serve until 2028. (Binsoy Velasquez)

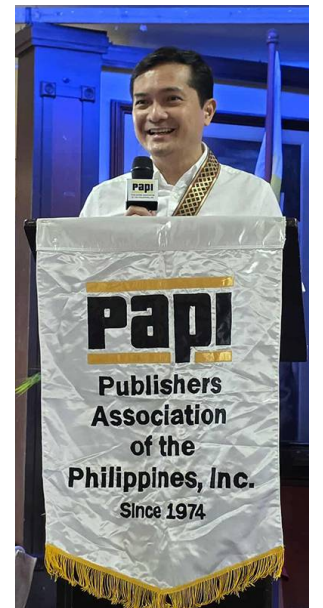
Secretary Ruiz's message underscored the urgency of truth-telling in today's media landscape. "Labanan ang kumakalat na fake news," he firmly stated, calling for stronger legislation and penalties against those who deliberately spread false information. His remarks drew resounding support from attendees who shared the growing concern over the erosion of public trust caused by misinformation.

Ruiz also highlighted the administration's three major communication and public engagement programs under President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. The first is the Bagong Pilipinas Presidential Action Center, a one-stop hub meant to directly connect citizens with government services. The second, as

emphasized, is the national fight against fake news. The third is People-Centered Communication - an initiative designed to bring government closer to the people by ensuring they are well-informed of their rights and the services available to them.

"Let the people know what benefits they can get from the government," Ruiz stressed, reinforcing the principle that communication is not just about information dissemination, but also about empowerment and inclusive governance. His words served as a reminder that the media and government must work together to ensure that citizens are not only informed but also protected from manipulation.

The event also highlighted the strengthening partnership between PAPI and the PCO. Both institutions affirmed their commitment to developing information channels that resonate with the needs and concerns of the public. Through collaboration, they aim to amplify voices of truth and provide platforms that support honest reporting and civic education.



In closing, Secretary Ruiz's message resonated deeply with the PAPI members present. The shared vision of a "Bagong Pilipinas" rests on the shoulders of a well-informed citizenry - one that is equipped not only with facts but with the power to discern and engage. As Ruiz aptly put it, "In a Bagong Pilipinas, a well-informed citizen is an empowered citizen."

This gathering served as a renewed call for solidarity among journalists, communicators, and public servants to rise above falsehoods and stand united in service of truth, transparency, and the Filipino people. (Reyland Lopez)

Development - IVA, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP), Philippine National Police (PNP), and the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG).

Also present during the activity was OCD Region IV-A Regional Director Carlos Eduardo Q. Alvarez III, who delivered an inspirational message underscoring the importance of preparedness, collaboration, and

continuous learning in minimizing the impact of natural disasters. He commended the Provincial Government of Cavite and all participating agencies for their dedication to strengthening local disaster response mechanisms.

The exercise was structured into three key modules. The first module, Initial Response and Guidelines, focused on activating emergency protocols, facilitating

information flow, and rapidly assessing initial damages and casualties immediately after the earthquake.

The second module, Response, emphasized inter-agency coordination, deployment of resources, maintaining communication lines, and real-time situational reporting in a dynamic emergency environment. The final module, Review, provided a platform to evaluate the activity, identify operational gaps, share best practices, and recommend strategies to

enhance the province's earthquake preparedness and response systems.

Through the simulation, participants assessed the effectiveness of current contingency plans and strengthened coordination among response units in the event of a major seismic event.

The TTX also served as a vital step in enhancing Cavite's overall disaster resilience by identifying challenges and crafting proactive solutions to mitigate the impacts of large-scale earthquakes. (JDP)

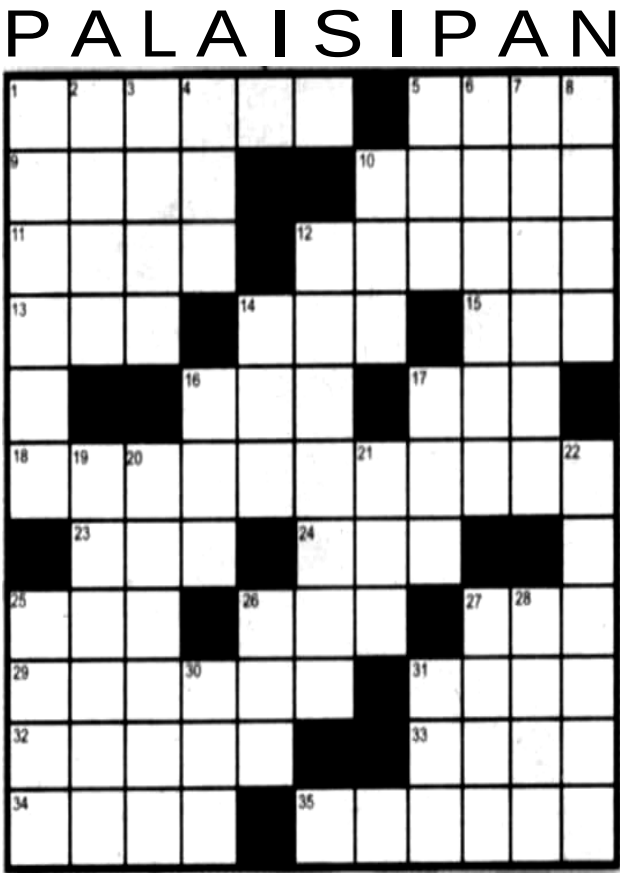

PTFOMS Monitoring Probe into Killing of Former Radio Broadcaster in General Santos

The Presidential Task Force on Media Security (PTFOMS) is closely monitoring the ongoing investigation into the fatal shooting of former radio anchor Ali Macalintal on Monday, June 23, 2025, in General Santos City.

Macalintal, a former broadcaster for RPN-DXDX General Santos, sustained three gunshot wounds and was declared dead on arrival at a nearby hospital. In coordination with the Philippine National Police (PNP) Region 12, PTFOMS is investigating the motive behind the attack, including the possibility that it may be connected to the victim's previous work in media. PTFOMS is coordinating with local law enforcement units and monitoring developments through its network of Media Security Vanguards—PNP Public Information Officers trained to respond to threats and violence against journalists. The Task Force assures the public and the media community that justice will be pursued with urgency and transparency.
