

Cavite Police gear up for safe, orderly Undas



IMUS, Cavite (PIA) — The Cavite Police Provincial Office is all set to ensure a smooth, safe, and peaceful observance of Undas 2025 as part of the nationwide “Ligtas Undas” operational plan of the Philippine National Police (PNP).

The Cavite PPO, led by Acting Provincial Director Police Colonel Ariel Red, has mapped out comprehensive security and public assistance measures in anticipation of the influx of visitors to cemeteries and memorial parks across the province from October 29 to

November 4, 2025.

According to police estimates, around 451,300 people are expected to visit 116 cemeteries (54 public and 62 private sites) as well as five columbariums throughout Cavite. To mitigate public safety risks

DepEd mulls leasing closed private schools to ease classroom shortage

The Department of Education (DepEd) is exploring the feasibility of leasing closed private schools and other underutilized private properties as part of its innovative approach to ease the country's classroom shortage, which reached over 165,000 in 2022.

In collaboration with the Student First Coalition (SFC) and various government agencies, DepEd recently conducted a Classroom Market Scoping Activity to assess available properties and potential partnership models with the private sector.

The initiative aims to make classroom leasing a scalable and cost-effective strategy nationwide.

“We need to think creatively if we want to move fast,” DepEd Secretary Sonny Angara said in a statement on Thursday.

“If there are schools or buildings sitting idle that can be used, let's open them for the benefit of our learners who need classrooms now.”

The market scoping activity presented DepEd's Standard Classroom Specifications, current classroom needs, and details of its Leasing Pilot Program, followed by a forum with property developers and government partners.

Among those who participated were major real estate firms including Colliers, Santos Knight Frank, Leechiu, Jones Lang LaSalle Inc., Lobien Realty Group and REBAP Inc.

Key government agencies such as the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development, Bases Conversion and Development Authority, Department of the Interior and Local Government and the Armed Forces of

DOST Ilocos Region and PNP Region 1 Strengthen Partnership to Ensure Safety and Security For the Upcoming 2025 National Science and Technology Week in Laoag City

The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Ilocos Region through Regional Director Teresita A. Tabaog and Assistant Regional Director for Field Operations Decth-1180 P. Libunao and the Philippine National Police (PNP) Region 1 formally sealed their partnership for the safety and security of the 2025 National Science and Technology Week (NSTW) through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) signing held on October 23, 2025 in Laoag City.



The MOU was signed by DOST Regional Director Teresita A. Tabaog and PNP Regional Director PBGEN Dindo R. Reyes, signifying the agencies shared commitment to uphold peace, order, and public safety during the four-day NSTW celebration

happening on November 18–21, 2025, to be hosted by DOST Ilocos Region.

Under the MOU, DOST Ilocos Region and PNP Region 1 will collaborate to ensure the safety of exhibitors, guests, and visitors throughout the event. The PNP will

provide security assistance, crowd control, traffic management, and emergency response coordination, while DOST will handle logistical and communication support to facilitate smooth coordination during the event.



The 2025 National Science and Technology Week, hosted for the first time by DOST Ilocos Region in Laoag City, will gather scientists, researchers, innovators, MSMEs, students, and the general public under the theme "Building Smart and Sustainable Communities" and the subtheme "Siyensya, Teknolohiya, at

Inobasyon: Kabalikay sa Matatag, Maginhawa, at Panatag na Kinabukasan" The event will feature exhibits, fora, technology demonstrations, and interactive activities that highlight the transformative role of science and technology in national development.

and hazards, 2,422 personnel will be deployed in Cavite—comprising 1,250 PNP officers, 176 augmentation units, and 996 force multipliers from various community groups and organizations.

Red said force multipliers will be crucial in the operation, with 996 volunteers helping in different roles. These include Barangay Tanods maintaining order in cemeteries and nearby communities; Barangay Peacekeeping Action Teams (BPATs) managing crowd control and public information; traffic enforcers directing vehicle flow; security guards protecting private cemeteries and establishments; radio groups supporting

communication; and volunteer organizations, including civic and faith-based groups, assisting visitors.

Cavite Police will also establish 117 Police Assistance Desks (PADs) and 23 Motorist Assistance Centers (MACs), supported by 19 Blue Teams that will conduct continuous patrols and monitoring.

Deployment highlights include 311 personnel for Police Assistance Desks (PADs), 68 personnel for Motorist Assistance Centers (MACs), 189 roving officers, 200 traffic marshals for major roads, 191 personnel for checkpoint and Oplan Sita operations, 87 officers for firewall operations, 34 personnel at transport terminals, and 167

personnel in areas of convergence.

Red emphasized that even with the public safety plans of his office, public cooperation remains crucial to the success of the operation.

“Our goal is not only to ensure a safe and orderly Undas but also to uphold peace and discipline among citizens. Let us work together to remain vigilant and responsible for the safety of our families and communities,” he said.

In May, FNG reported the 100-percent takeup of the first tranche of commercial lots at Riverpark. The buyers will develop these lots into office, retail and other mixed-use facilities.

“Ateneo’s presence in Riverpark not only strengthens the

educational landscape of Cavite but also uplifts the lives of the communities we serve,” GT Capital vice chair Alfred Ty said in a press statement on Monday.

“Our investment in this campus reflects our long-term commitment to creating sustainable value for generations of Filipinos,

anchored on the values of excellence and service,” Ty added.

“The new Ateneo campus in Riverpark allows us to extend our mission and provide more families in Cavite and nearby provinces with access to quality education rooted in our Jesuit tradition,” Ateneo de Manila University president Fr. Roberto Yap said. **/dda**

the Philippines Corps of Engineers also took part in the discussion.

“This effort turns the classroom shortage crisis into an opportunity for collaboration and innovation,” DepEd Undersecretary for Strategic Management Ronald Mendoza said.

“Instead of waiting two to three years for new classrooms to be

constructed, we are identifying existing facilities that can be adapted within six months to meet students’ needs.”

One of the first properties being considered for lease is the Pita Property, formerly the Rainbow Institute of Learning, Inc., in Laguna. The 1,385-square-meter campus, closed since 2020, sits only two

kilometers from Don Manuel Rivera Memorial Integrated National High School, which currently lacks 22 classrooms.

The property includes seven classrooms, cafeteria, an office and a covered court with a stage—facilities that DepEd believes could be quickly repurposed for immediate use.

DepEd clarified that the leasing initiative will complement, not replace, its ongoing infrastructure programs such as the Flexible School Building Implementation Plan and public-private partnerships for school construction.

Insights gathered from the market scoping activity will be presented at the upcoming Classroom Summit, where DepEd aims to consolidate reform proposals and design new models for school infrastructure delivery. **(PNA)**

Preserving Tradition through Science DOST Secretary Solidum Witnesses How Innovation Colors the Future of Future of Filipino Silk Weaving in Misamis Oriental

On October 20, 2025, Department of Science and Technology (DOST) Secretary Renato U. Solidum Jr. visited the ABAI (Ayala Beneficiaries Association, Inc.) Weavers Multi-Purpose Cooperative and the Philippine Textile Research Institute's (PTRI) Natural Dyes Hub in Laguindingan, Misamis Oriental, where culture and innovation merge to sustain the province's rich silk weaving heritage.



A beneficiary of both the Community Empowerment through Science and Technology (CEST) program and DOST-PTRI, the cooperative received assistance in 2018 under the project "Upgrading of Silk Weaving Center at Laguindingan." Through this, ABAI was provided with 10 handlooms and underwent specialized trainings on cellulosic fiber dyeing, silk yarn degumming, advanced 4-pedal handloom weaving, Suksuk (Pili design) weaving, and loom repair and maintenance. These interventions improved their craftsmanship, enhanced production quality, and promoted sustainable silk weaving practices in Region 10. During the visit,



Secretary Solidum observed weaving and natural dyeing demonstrations by four skilled members of the cooperative. Currently, ten active silk weavers in the province continue to strengthen the industry by training other weaving communities across Northern Mindanao—

passing on their artistry and technical knowledge to preserve this centuries-old craft.

Secretary Solidum lauded the cooperative's dedication to merging tradition with technology and emphasized how DOST's continued support bridges cultural preservation and

innovation. He also expressed his hope for the group to inspire and mentor young silk weavers through training and certification programs, ensuring that the artistry of Filipino weaving not only endures but flourishes—colored beautifully by science, technology, and innovation.
