GCV Big Victory — 3.5 Years of Faith and Perseverance



Today is a day to celebrate — the GCV big victory.

From May 2022 when I first shouted out during the Global Pioneers Conference on X Space, until today, November 2025, it has been 42 months — three and a half years of persistence, belief, and action.

GCV wins.
And when GCV

wins, it means Pi Network wins.

Because GCV is the heart of the Pi Network — and only when the heart beats strongly can the body stay healthy and powerful.

The Beginning of a Vision

I still remember that day on the conference.

Pioneers were arguing endlessly — should Pi be \$1 or \$10? The discussion lasted almost two hours.

At that moment, I couldn't stay silent any longer. I spoke loudly and clearly:

"\$314,159 should be the value of Pi."

That statement changed everything.

Soon after, we held three global GCV conferences — the Consensus Conference, the Ecosystem Conference, and the Summary Conference.

From those events, the name GCV \$314,159 was born. After the conferences, our speeches were circulated widely across the world — read and shared more than 100,000 times.

That was when GCV began to spread its wings.

Trials and Transformation

Of course, our journey was never smooth.

We faced division, misunderstanding, and challenges from many sides and many countries.

During that period, I dedicated one full year to the Chinese community, helping to organize GCV barter events and build GCV influence.

Between June 2022 and July 2023, Chinese pioneers contributed an estimated 10 million USD in GCV barter value.

However, most of these barter events didn't generate true GCV data because many pioneers didn't yet have Pi in hand — they only signed contracts, owing Pi in the future.

Realizing this limitation, I decided to expand the movement globally.

In August 2023, I officially announced my departure from the Chinese leadership team and launched the Global GCV Movement.

I still remember recording the video announcement — promising to focus on global GCV education and writing to spread the message of true consensus.

The Global Rise

Over the past two years, our GCV community has grown into a truly global network — across more than 100 countries.

We established the GCV Ambassador System, the GCV Industry Alliance, and the Pi Network / GCV Warriors System — focusing on education, ecosystem development, and real-world GCV economy.

Together, we defended Pi Network and GCV on social media and built one of the strongest grassroots movements in Pi history.

Our victory was actually achieved on February 20, 2025 — though many pioneers couldn't yet see it.

They waited for the Core Team (CT) to announce it. But I said it many times:

"CT will not announce GCV — because they gave the power of Pi value to us."

PCT is responsible for technical and infrastructure development, not the economic value of Pi.

It is the pioneers who define and announce Pi's value.

The Global GCV Core Team, as the only official global pioneers' organization working tirelessly for years,

holds the authority to announce the GCV value — \$314,159.

The Evidence of Victory

Today, our declaration is not based on estimation, expectation, or analysis — it is based on observation and verification.

We have seen PCT's technical and economic infrastructure evolving to implement the GCV system in practice.

Their progress reflects our collective achievements. I have explained this logic many times:

The process starts when pioneers create Pi value from theory to practice.

Once GCV occupies more than 80% of blockchain records, the consensus is confirmed.

That is why, for over a year, I promoted the Win-Win Strategy — allowing partial Pi payments at GCV value.

Through this strategy, we created more than 20 million pieces of GCV data, proving that GCV has become the living heartbeat of the Pi economy.

A New Chapter

Today, we can say with confidence:

PCT has accepted our GCV.

The Pi Network ecosystem is moving in perfect alignment with the GCV logic built by pioneers.

This victory belongs not to one person, but to all pioneers who believed, acted, and stood firm when others doubted.

Let us celebrate — but also prepare for the next phase.

Now that GCV has won, we must build the real economy around it.

Education, ecosystem development, and real transactions will carry Pi into its true destiny as the world's most inclusive digital currency.

From that first voice on X Space in 2022 to the global movement of today, our journey proves one truth:

"Consensus is not given — it is created."

The heartbeat of GCV now echoes through the world.

Let it grow stronger, deeper, and unstoppable.

Pi Network has officially released Pi Node Version 0.5.4, delivering significant improvements in performance, reliability, and user experience for the Pi Desktop application.

Konektadong Pinoy law ensures access to reliable internet service

Access to affordable, faster, and reliable internet service has been ensured following the signing of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of the Konektadong Pinoy (KP) Act or Republic Act 12234.

The IRR was signed on Wednesday by Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev) Secretary Arsenio Balisacan, Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) Secretary Henry Aguda, Philippine Competition Commission (PCC) Executive Director Kenneth Tanate and lawyer Alfred Francis Gallegos from the

National Telecommunications Commission (NTC), DEPDev said in a press release Friday.

It will take effect 15 calendar days after publication, it said.

DEPDev said the "IRR establishes performance standards and cybersecurity safeguards to ensure that internet services are not only accessible but also safe and dependable."

It said "smaller and community-based providers will also benefit from simplified registration and streamlined processes, making it easier for them to bring connectivity to areas that have long been underserved."

Citing Balisacan's speech during the ceremonial signing ceremony at the DICT office in Quezon City, the press release said the said

law "is ultimately about more than infrastructure and regulation."

"It is about people. It is about ensuring that students can learn that small enterprises can thrive, and that local governments can deliver better public services," he said. "Connectivity is not merely convenient. It is essential to socioeconomic participation and central to enabling innovation, education, and progress."



The KP Act is in line with DEPDev's policy advocacy work, including the 2024 Policy Note on Open

DepEd assures learning continuity as it ramps up typhoon preparedness

The Department of Education (DepEd) on Friday assured that it is fully prepared for the possible impact of tropical cyclone Uwan while continuing rehabilitation and learning recovery efforts in schools affected by Typhoon Tino.

To maintain learning continuity, Education Secretary Sonny Angara has ordered the deployment of EduKahon kits and alternative learning materials to affected schools.

The Department will also utilize Dynamic Learning Program Learning Activity Sheets (DLP-LAS) to ensure students can continue learning even during emergencies.

DepEd TV will further

support education recovery through TV-based learning in partnership with the Knowledge Channel and Solar Pictures.

In terms of rehabilitation, Angara emphasized that the safety and welfare of learners remain the top priority.

"DepEd will continue working with local governments, partners, and communities so that no child is left behind in the aftermath of any disaster,"

he said.

According to DepEd's Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Service (DRRMS), the agency needs PHP1.86 billion for minor classroom repairs and PHP30.63 million for cleanup and clearing operations in 407 affected schools.

"This is about rebuilding hope and stability for our learners. Our priority is safety, and the quick restoration of learning spaces," Angara said.

Fernando launches province-wide directive to institutionalize earthquake drills and secure critical infrastructure

CITY OF MALOLOS – Governor Daniel R. Fernando has mandated an immediate, province-wide intensification of disaster preparedness measures, focusing on the structural safety of educational institutions, establishment of dedicated, open-site evacuation centers and institutionalization of earthquake drills.

The governor's directives were issued during the Joint PDRMC and C/MDRRMOs Full Council Meeting yesterday, underscoring the necessity of a swift and decisive pivot toward maximum resilience.

This follows the updates from the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS) and structural reports submitted by the Department of Education (DepEd) Bulacan.

In her presentation, Myleen C. Enriquez, Science Research Specialist of PHIVOLCS-DOST, highlighted the Philippines' position as one of the world's most seismically active regions, presenting the 'Orientation on Recent Earthquake Events and Possible Impacts of the West Valley Fault'.

Enriquez said the West Valley Fault, which traverses nearby provinces, has not moved in approximately 400 years, raising the possibility of a major movement, heightening the risk of a significant

movement that could trigger 'The Big One', from which she introduced PHIVOLCS tools such as GeoRiskPH, HazardHunterPH, and the "How Safe is My House", helping citizens and local governments assess building safety and hazards in their areas, with more information available at phivolcs.dost.gov.ph.

"Natural ang lindol at iba pang sakuna, pero ang trahedya ay maaari nating maiwasan sa pamamagitan ng kahandaan at tamang pagtugon," she reminded the participants.

This cautionary note was immediately contextualized by a report from Peter C. Lacap, DepEd Bulacan DRRM focal person, that as of October 23, 2025, 287 of 412 elementary schools and 75 of 100 secondary schools have submitted building inspection reports conducted by municipal/city engineers wherein findings underscored that 104 elementary and 36 secondary schools were tagged as unsafe,

involving a total of 416 classrooms requiring major repair or further engineering validation.

DepEd Bulacan is now coordinating with LGUs for rapid validation and structural reinforcement, prioritizing the development of robust Learning Continuity Plans and updated earthquake contingency measures to mitigate risks to students and personnel.

While expressing gratitude that Bulacan was spared by recent weather events, Fernando stressed that this reprieve must be seized to accelerate pre-disaster operational readiness and established a clear and binding mandates for all local government units, including

1) Establishment of Designated Open Evacuation Sites: LGUs must immediately identify, mark, and publicize dedicated, open evacuation areas and appoint a primary contact person in each site for earthquake response management; 2) Swift Procurement and Distribution of Emergency essentials: The PGB will oversee the rapid distribution of flashlights, whistles with lanyard, water bottles, and vital emergency provisions; and 3) Institutionalizing Drills and Safety Protocols: A formal memorandum will be issued requiring the inclusion of earthquake drills in schools' daily morning activities.

"Hindi naman po ako kontra sa 'duck, cover, and hold' dahil epektibo po ito sa mga mahihinang lindol," he said. "Pero sa panahon ngayon na malalakas na ang pagyanig, mas mainam na lumabas sa mga open site para mas ligtas. Dapat po nating paghandaan ito, lalo na ang mga bukas na lugar sa mga paaralan at mga tahanan."

The Provincial Government's action plan is focused on preemptive intervention to secure Bulacan's future against predictable seismic threats, ensuring that preparedness is a continuous and operational state, not merely a reaction.

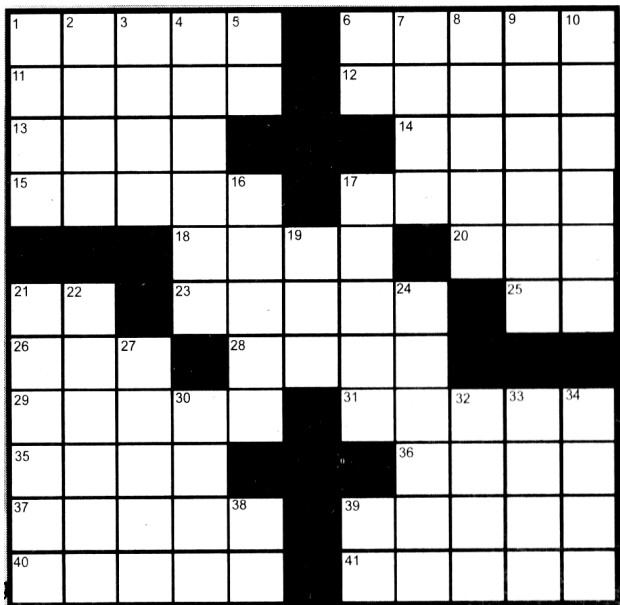

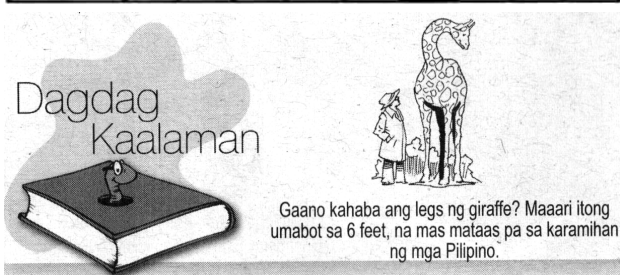

MPower inks deal to supply 150-hectare Cavite industrial park

MPower, the retail electricity unit of Manila Electric Co. (Meralco), has secured a deal to supply power to the 150-hectare industrial park in Cavite through the Energy Regulatory Commission's (ERC) new Retail Aggregation Program (RAP).

MPower is partnering with the First Cavite Industrial Estate Association, Inc. (FCIE) to consolidate the estate's energy demand, allowing the mixed-use development to customize its power supply procurement. The capacity to be supplied by MPower was not

immediately disclosed. The RAP, an initiative introduced by the ERC earlier this year, permits end-users within the same franchise area to pool their demand to meet the 500-kilowatt (kW) threshold. Meeting this benchmark allows them to qualify as "contestable customers" and select

their own power supplier at a competitive rate. Micaela Laila Flores, FCIE president, stated the collaboration is a "strategic step toward advancing sustainability and operational excellence in the industrial sector." "It reflects FCIE's steadfast vision to be a
