# DSWD strengthens shelter inspection, suspends unlicensed facility

Stepping up inspections of residential care facilities to ensure the protection and welfare of vulnerable populations, especially children, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), on Thursday, January 29, discovered twelve individuals, including minors, in an unlicensed shelter in Barangay Landayan, San Pedro, Laguna.

The operation was led by the DSWD Standards Bureau (SB), in partnership with the City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of San Pedro and DSWD Field Office IV-A (CALABARZON). Representatives from the barangay and local law enforcement were present to guarantee an orderly and transparent inspection.

Earlier in 2025, the DSWD IV-A, led by the Regional Juvenile Justice and Welfare Council (RJJWC), conducted multiple monitoring visits of Bahay Pag-asa and other residential care facilities in CALABARZON. These activities aimed to verify that facilities comply with national regulations and provide proper care, protection, and rehabilitation for children in their custody.

The inspected shelter,

operated by vlogger Benjie Perillo (BenchTV), was immediately ordered to suspend operations for lacking the mandatory Certificate of Registration and License to Operate (CRLTO).

Following the inspection, six residents, including two minors, were temporarily placed under DSWD care to receive appropriate support and interventions. The City Health Office (CHO) of San Pedro conducted medical checks, while licensed social workers handled profiling, documentation, and case management. The individuals were later referred to assigned social workers to ensure continued access to assistance programs.

The DSWD also provided guidance to the shelter operator on the process of securing a CRLTO and emphasized that adherence to national

standards is essential to guarantee the safety and well-being of all residents.

The agency reiterated its commitment to the protection of vulnerable groups, particularly children, and stressed that routine inspections and enforcement actions will continue to ensure all care facilities meet required standards. (CCM/PIA-CALABARZON)

According to Dr. Bryan Jason Borja, Head of the Biñan City Culture, History, Arts, and Tourism Office, the Tanda at Tala: The Biñan Memory Project, an Elder's Oral History Forum is part of the city government's efforts to document and preserve the historical accounts of Biñan's elders.

"This was a concept of Mayor Gel Alonte, when we were discussing recently what we could do, we noted that Biñan has been continuously recording its history. He suggested that it would be good to also record the memories of the

elders, so that the younger generation would better understand what the elders are talking about and what Biñan was like in the past," Borja said during a radio program interview with the Philippine Information Agency on January 28.

BCHATO will invite elders from the city to participate in a talk show-style program, where they will be interviewed and encouraged to freely share and answer questions based on the stories and memories they fondly remember.

Borja stated that these oral histories will be recorded, archived, and

eventually developed into educational materials that may be distributed to schools for future use, ensuring that the city's heritage and collective memory are passed on to the next generation.

The Biñan city government has long been implementing cultural and historical initiatives including heritage mapping and installation of markers on various historical and cultural sites. The city vows to roll out new programs each year to enrich and preserve the city's history and heritage.

With this year's theme, "Biñan: Buhay ang Nakaraan, Sumasalubong

sa Hinaharap", Borja said that the city reflects their efforts in preserving their roots and history as a step towards navigating a better future for each Biñanense.

Tanda at Tala: The Biñan Memory Project, an Elder's Oral History Forum, is one of the highlights of the highly anticipated three-day city-wide celebration from February 2 to February 4. accredited health facilities, even if they are not yet experiencing symptoms.

"Our government wants our citizens to be free from illness. The message of PhilHealth Yakap is, whether you are well or not, sick or not, get checked. That is our battle cry. So as we launch Yakap (program) we will further inform our countrymen of the benefits and privileges of this program," Ardiente stated.

Under the program, members may avail of consultations and screening services such as blood pressure monitoring, blood sugar

tests, cholesterol checks, and other basic diagnostics, depending on the assessment of healthcare providers. These services are covered by PhilHealth when accessed through participating government and private facilities.

Ardiente then emphasized that preventive care is a key component of the country's Universal Health Care (UHC) Act, as it helps reduce hospital admissions and out-of-pocket expenses for Filipino families.

"Prevention is better

than cure. Through YAKAP, we want to encourage members to take care of their health before they get sick," he stated.

Members are advised to bring their PhilHealth ID or any valid ID and verify their membership status before visiting accredited facilities. Dependents who are qualified under the principal member may also avail of the benefits.

The agency reiterated its commitment to strengthening its preventive healthcare services and ensuring that quality, accessible, and affordable health care remains within reach of every Filipino. (AM/PIA Calabarzon)

# DPWH taps Church for monitoring infra projects

TAGAYTAY CITY, Cavite (PIA) — With over 30,000 ongoing projects all over the country, the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) has called on the Catholic Church and civil society organizations to serve as 'watchdogs' who will help improve transparency and responsiveness of government programs.

Speaking at the 42nd National Social Action General Assembly (NASAGA) hosted by Caritas Philippines on February 3, Secretary Vince Dizon admitted that the sheer volume of projects under its belt—over 30,000 ongoing nationwide—surpasses the department's monitoring capacity.

"Aaminin ko na hindi namin mababantayan lahat 'yan nang tama dahil sa sheer number. [At] sa dami natio, kailangan namin ang tulong ng mga diocese, mga civil society organization, [at] ng Caritas."

The DPWH is collaborating with Caritas Philippines, the social action arm of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of the Philippines (CBCP), to oversee its projects.

"Apart sa imbestigasyon, kailangan rin natin ang tulong ng simbahan sa pagmonit ng mga report, mga ospital. Ang problema po, the DPWH does not have the capacity to monitor everything. So we really need the support of the church and civil society



in the local areas to help us out."

Beyond monitoring, the CBCP also advocates for projects responsive to community needs.

"Needs-based ang ating budget. Anu-ano po ba ang mga project na kailangan ng ating mga kababayan? At dyan po napakarami ng ating pakikipag-usap sa CBCP at sa Caritas."

Dizon also credited the CBCP and Caritas, along with various Non-Government

Organizations, to ensure a multi-sectoral approach in monitoring infrastructure projects.

"Mayroon tayong Memorandum of Cooperation kasama ang CBCP at Caritas. Kailangang kailangan natin 'yung tulong nila kasi hindi naman kayang i-monitor lahat ng DPWH ang libu-libong projects. Kailangan natin ang tulong ng simbahan at ng NGOs para mag-monitor."

"Halos 300,00 ang proyekto ng DPWH from

2016, at halos 30,000 ang ongoing. Aaminin ko, hindi namin mababantayan 'yan ng tama dahil sa sheer number, sa dami nito kaya kailangan namin ang tulong ng ating mga diocese, mga civil society organization, ng Caritas."

To recall, the DPWH launched a transparency portal designed to grant public access to information on over 247,000 infrastructure projects dating back to 2016. **(PB-PIA4A)**


